The selectmen's advisory board met this week with Selectman Percy Cook to discuss various possibilities of what can be done about another dump truck for the town and dump truck for the town and bulldozer-tractor.

The board treated the t

pieces of equipment separately since they had completely inde-pendent functions and the uses of each did not overlap. On the matter of a truck, selectmen had felt that poss the town could purchase a light duty truck to be used for mino work, thus saving the present two dump trucks for the heavy road work. It was pointed out that one of the trucks is over five years old and experien an increasing number of breal

downs and repairs.

Last year, Cook presented a proposal to purchase a new truck because he felt the town needed one at that time. The board, after discussing the merits of repairing the truck and purchasing a light duty truck, or purchasing a new road truck, felt that a new heavy-duty truck should be purchased at this time. The present road truck can be maintained as a spare for snowplowing or emergency work, although it is not depend-able enough to count on contin-

uously. If next winter proves to be a series of snowfalls for 5 or 6 months, the truck would not stand up to the burden of continuous winter operation.

It was estimated that a serviceable heavy duty road truck could be purchased for about \$8,500, the funds for which are available in the town's equipment fund.

The buildozer-tractor in use at the landfill area is now 6 years old and burns oil to the extent of one gallon per day. It would cost an estimated \$7,000 to \$8,000 to overhaul this piece of equipment, with a life expectancy of 2-4 years.

Prpairing the buildoser and gaining a life expectancy of three years would amount to an

estimated \$2,500 annual cost. A new piece of similar equipment costs approximately \$22,000. If the town were to trade in the present buildozer at a price of \$10,000, it would cost \$22,000. The buildozer is used daily in the landfill operation. It would also be used for the crushing o glass, and a new one would not have the maintenance and repair cost that an overhauled The board, after co




