The scientist of the week, or perhaps he is scientist of the month, or may even prove to be scientist of the year, is a Swiss gentleman named Dr. Daniel Bovet, who now lives and experiments in Rome, and the charm and joy in having him on the contemporary scene is that, after the most intensive kind of modernistic psychological research, he ceeps coming up with the message that uman beings are infinitely variable and dividualistic, no matter how much we aprove their intelligence or intensify

Dr. Bovet specializes in training and serving mice, and he has come up with a number of beautiful observations. One of the fundamental laws he claims to have discovered is that if a test animal is properly stimulated and conditioned, it will do as it pleases.

He is fond, too, of quoting the laboratory rat whom he caught boasting to another: "I've got that lab assistant perfeetly trained—every time I run through the maze, he feeds me." Most precious of all, Dr. Boven has

discovered a particular mouse which, after having been thoroughly trained to expect electric shocks if he entered a shuttle box, would nevertheless periodically keep going back into the box just to see if anything had changed, his curiosity being that much greater than his fear the electric shocks.

That is, of course, a kind of failure in Dr. Bovet's training course, so far as that particular mouse is concerned.

But he has other heartening failures to report. He says that, despite his efforts breed and train uniformity, he is still etting "animals that are very active and animals that are sluggish, animals that sleep by day and animals that sleep by night, animals that prefer alcohol and animals that prefer water, animals that have a great curiosity for exploration and animals that are conservative."

Red Tanks Crush Three Bases

SAIGON (AP) — Spear-headed by tanks, a North Viet-namese division smashed the northern defenses of Kontum City in the central highlands to-day and drove South Vietnam-ese forces as far back as 15 miles. New air and sea battles erupted deep inside North Viet-nam, in the Gulf of Tonkin and

The highlands defense line of Tan Canh and Dak To, 25 miles north of Kontum, crumbled un-der the enemy onslaught and a new line was being formed 10

Canh and about 10 miles north of Kontum. Other lesser bases and towns crumbled in the path of the North Vietnamese onslaught.

Despite the critical situation in the highlands, hundreds of South Vicinamese paratroopers were being pulled out of Kontum Province and being deploy-

ed to the Saigon region to beef up defenses. Ranger units were moved from northern Quang Tri Province to the highlands in a reshuffling of thinly spread government forces.

The Saigon command claimed more than 200 North Vistnamese troops were killed in fighting Sunday on the northern front below the demilitarized zone and at An Loc, 50 miles north of Saigon. Three
