Better A Rocking Chair

Everybody is busy analyzing the Muskie collapse, and one elemental answer everybody ought to include in every explanation is that there is automatic peril for anybody who has to run out in front through the kind of pressure a succession of primaries and the constant coverage of the media now builds into a presidential campaign year.

If there is a weakness in a candidate. the long and torturous ordeal is sure to bring it out. If he has a virtue, he may be punished instead of rewarded for it. Governor George Romney, four years ago, had much the same experience Senator Muskie has had now, and at least a substantial part of his misfortune, too, was attributable to the merciless kind of exposure the campaign itself and the incessantly watchful presence of the media

Perhaps, too, however, such front runners make mistakes. That is what all the analysis of the Muskie collapse assumes. One mistake he himself admits is that he tried to spread himself too thin, running in every conceivable primary against every conceivable combination of oppo-

Other analysts offer other Musicie 'mistakes." They say he lacked decisiveness in campaign strategy and in his campaign stands. They accuse him of not hitting hard enough, of not taking the right advice, of not giving his followers an emotional inspiration, of displaying his own emotions too publicly. Senstor Muskie can, if he wishes, spend the rest of this presidential year reading contradictory descriptions of the mistakes

Perhaps the big single mistake was that he undertook, in an understandable mixture of honesty and ambition, to campaign at all.

Apparently what he himself had in mind was that, if he was being rated highly enough to seem to be the front runner for the 1972 nomination, it would be both honest and smart of him to campaign arduously and extensively. It would be honest in that it would give the voters a fair chance to look him over from every angle. It might be smart in that it would lock the nomination up with delegates as well as with general senti-

But when he made the decision to do what seemed the honest thing for the voters and the smart thing for himself, he entered all the routines of all the candidates. He, too, was now cultivating and nanufacturing and trying to sell an mage. The image that emerged from all this effort was less attractive than the image the voters themselves had previously formed of him.

The more he tried to do the winning hing, the less natural and genuine he eemed, and seeming natural and renuine had been his own original gilt edge political security.

We will advise the next presidential ampaign front runner we see, comfortbly out front about 15 months before the ctual election, to buy himself a rocking chair, and try sitting on his front porch intil the convention itself sends for him.


Marigolds

Flourish By Sheila & Allan Swenson

Yes, you can plant mules and get a colorful kick from them, too. Mules are the newest type of marigolds. They flower early, are everblooming and low enough for beds and borders. They dis-play an array of shades from yellow through gold to orange.

Mules are unique. These marigolds are triploid hybrids. That means they're crosses between the large American marigold and the tiny French types. French marigolds have double the chromosomes American types do. So, like mule animals, these crosses cannot reproduce themselves.

To compensate for this they bloom and bloom and bloom in an attempt to set seeds. The seed firms must cross varieties each year to



Nugget marigolds are the earliest flowering ever. They start in early June and keep going till frost. Only 12 inches tall, maturing in five weeks, these are ideal for fast color and displays in the g a r d e n, windowboxes or potted displays for portable color. An extra advantage is their strong insect and disease resistance.

The new Seven Star marigold, introduced for 1972, is the largest flowered mule marigold yet produced. These begin bearing 6 weeks from seed on compact plants that fit into mid-beds and borders. You can enjoy them right through frost. Since they don't know they can't set seed, they bear profuse-ly in a multi-hued profusion.

HEW Funds TV Shorts for Kids

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Children in the U.S. watch between 30 and 50 hours of television a week, according to survey estimates.

With that much exposure, the tots to teens viewers hopefully could learn a lot of useful things from the nation's No. 1 babysitter TV's critics, however, claim the medium falls far short of its teaching putential with most programming not educational in intent With that much exposure

callifornia organization that's produced educational/entertaining programs for 25 years) with a proposal for a series of segments on health, nutrition and growing up. The segments were to be shown in institutions across the country. Sutherland then came to me (Keeshan has his own production company for Captain Kangaroo) and saked me whether I'd like to incorporate the segments into our show. I would do a few-minutes' introduction to the topics and make some concluding remarks.

"I thought the idea was great and I went to CBS Fresident Bob Wood with the

suggestion. He agreed. And here we are. It's not as if the government gave CBS m one y for programming. These s hows would have been made anyway. We're just featuring them on our show."

Keeshan sees the segments as an extension of program-ming he has been doing for children for nearly 17 years. Adults will learn from them,

For example, one segment "Brushing Your Teeth with Food," has an animated character explain to children that certain foods—such as raw carrols, raw cellery. corn on the cob—are natural "toothbrushes" that remove food particles from between teeth. Another segment deals with loneliness and being alone.

The theme song for the se-ries sums up its basic phil-

osophy: "You Are the Most Important Person in the World—to You."

When Keeshan began his Captain Kangaroo program in 1955, he had what was then a unique approach to children's programming. As Clarabelle on the old Howdy Doody Show, he had squirted a seltzer bottle at people and thrown pies in their faces to entertain children. As the Captain, he opted for a gentle approach, a combination of entertainment and education, based on two main prinof entertainment and educa-tion, based on two main prin-ciples: (1) that a child is an intelligent human being who deserves respect; and (2) that a child, potentially, has good taste and it is up to children's programmers to encourage that good taste.


