Grim Days In Vietnam

Later on, in some happier day, we may be having it explained to us that what is really going on, during the present military action in Vietnam, is the final exhaustion of North Vietnam's potential military effort.

Vietnam put everything it had into this current offensive, that, although it achieved instant and unnerving successes which caused near-panic in Saigon and in Washington, it was paying a heavier price than it could afford, and that, in the end, it missed out on its real objective, which was the complete destruction of South Vietnam's military

We may get such a story later on, and we may be fortunate enough to have, in the continued existence of a government in Saigon, in the continued existence of a military line somewhere in South Vietnam across which the enemy has not extended his own recontrol of the country, some valid invitation to believe such a ersion of the campaign of 1972.

For the moment, the testimony from the front itself is heavily weighted toward less pleasant short range possi-

Once again, reports suggest that the South Vietnamese, for some reason, do not have a will to fight. The news suggests that Vietnamization, instead of working, is receding to the status of an imaginary program which never had any

Once again, too, the news suggests that just about everybody connected underestimated the war-making capacity of North Vietnam and overestimated the efficiency of American bombs in blunting that capacity.

What the current news suggests, again, is that whatever we try in Vietnam, we can't win for losing, that the whole thing has been inevitably hopeless from the start, not to be healed or strengthened by the best or the most intelligent of policies, but always and forever hopeless, period.

Some American Presidents went into Vietnam with what may have seemed to them limited, honorable, necessary objectives. President Nixon has been trying to get out of Vietnam. But he, as much as his predecessors, may still be, as they were, the tragic prisoner of the fatal original commitment, Sometimes it seems a mistake to try to rationalize the story of Vietnam, and more appropriate, and perhaps just as practical, to look upon the whole thing as the remorseless unfolding of a Greek tragedy in which everybody is eventually going to lose much more than anything originally was worth.

#### On The Books

What happened when Connecticut adopted its first no-fault auto insurance system was that both the insurance industry and the legal profession dealt some hurt to each other. The lawyers seem certain to lose some share of a particular kind of business because their services will no longer be necessary in many instances of injury. But before the bill got out of the General Assembly, they were able to fix upon the insurance companies a mandatory 10 per cent decrease in rates which was intended to be some kind of limitation on the financial gain the insurance industry could expect from the no fault system.

The public can take whatever savings result from this cross-ruffing of the two special interests involved in the business of injury on the highways.

After all, it is the public which pays them both. Whatever the interplay between the insurance industry and the legal profession, the dollars involved all come from one source - the citizen who pays the premiums.

It has been a tendency on the part of both the insurance industry and the legal profession to collaborate in extra-generous use of that premium dollar which has led to the high cost of insurance and then to the resultant demand for some reform like the no fault system.

Both the philosophy and the opportunism involved in the great inflation of settlements and awards (the amounts may have actually been peaking out about the time the no fault movement was launched) need to be checked and controlled and toned down.

These settlements and judgments were

frequently based on some kind of assumption that "nobody really paid" for them, that because the money was coming from the "fat" insurance companies, there was no reason not to be very generous. Part of the no fault reform is the ecognition that there is only the one place the money does come from, the citizen's pocket, and that the joy-ride system for redistributing it has to be brought under some kind of discipline. Connecticut may find, after it comes into effect next Jan. 1, that this first bill represents less progress and less reform than is now being hoped. But the start has been made; once on the books

fectly normal man will laugh at something wildly unreasonable. But no rational man laughs without reason. nerly straightforward newscasters are doing just that - laughing without reason; smiling, winking, and grinning among themselves as if their coterie was (as though such things still existed).

This strange development has nothing to do with what goes on in weather re orting. Those assorted signs, maps, and radar screens used on weather shows are, at best, an attempt to upstage the theater of the absurd. No one could pos sibly take such paraphernalis seriously But the comedic style, so appropriat elongated weather programs, doesn't lend itself to general newscasting. It is simply disconcerting to be watching a newscast while pondering the question


Why is that man laughing? The smiling newscaster may be an outgrowth of the discovery of the lighter side of the news. Perhaps some TV producers suddenly realized that all news casts need not be written with a Sacher-Masoch flavor, that people do enjoy a unny news story or one with a happy ending. Having made this discovery the producers rushed in only to learn the unsappy truth that most news is prosaic some sombrely important, and very little of it amusing. Then, from the people who gave you canned laughter, came the answer. Etch a perpetually inscrutable smile on the newscaster - in lieu of something funny to say.

Or the creation of the grinning newscaster may have other roots. Television could be reaching for that elusive quality "continuity," which is very difficult sular items and studded with com-

The desire for continuity may well be at the heart of the matter, and other eviince suggests this: The inane ball bouncing between TV newscasters ("Now here's Ed Pumperdime to tell you how our local nine won today's game." "Thanks, Joe. Our boys won to day's game 4 to 2. Now, back to Joe Bilingagate."); the extended use of panel formats for newscasters; and the timeconsuming repetition of "preview" head-lines to hold audiences attention.

All this does provide TV newscasts with more continuity, but they cannot help but detract from their raison d' etre, dissemination of news, It seems hard for an entertainment medium to inderstand that the packaging of daily TV news programs must take a back seat to news content. TV news and bulletins have long since

pre-empted the newspaper extra, and rightly so. They are faster, neater. Havng vanquished the Old Guard, though, it only fair that TV newscasts serve in its stead, which means delivering a precise, unfettered account of as much news as possible in their allotted time. A good sampling of audience opinion might be enlightening to news-show producers, For example, it might be discovered that viewers watch their regular news programs in their entirety, and that excessive smiling and continuity gimmicks aren't really necessary. #### One Market One World?

By JOHN CUNNIFF
NEW YORK (AP) — Canada's intentions to discourage foreign takeover of its companies unless stiff requirements d self-interest are met is nothing that wasn't expected. It was inevitable.

And it is inevitable too that similar confrontations are developing in other nations where industry is falling into the hands of foreign companies with foreign allegiances who, it is felt, take more than they contribute.

contribute. Whether they do is debatable, probably is unimportant What counts is the attitude of the country's citizens, and in an age of nationalism they of-ten resent what they once wel-

> The scenario is repeated time after time in country after country. The nation is underleveloped. It lacks capital and ther resources of its own, so it invites development by skilled foreign companies. So eager are they to obtain these skills that they some-times offer tax incentives to the big corporations of the devel-oped world. Often no artificial incentive is needed, and somemes not even an invitation.

There are thousands of com-panies today who need foreign evestments, if not for the mar kets that can be developed there then for the natural resources that can be extracted or cultivated and the labor force that can be developed or exploited.

We have in the industrial

world today what are called multinational companies. They are too big for one nation; they consider the entire world their nome and their market. But there is a catch: No matter if they operate in 50 countries, they are based in one. No natter how carefully they deal with the local citizenry, obey their laws, respect their society, encourage their cul-ture--their eventual allegiance is to another country.

P litically, that is, the world fragmented; it may be one market, but it still isn't one

inevitably, the conflicts arise. The developing country becomes stronger, prouder, more self-sufficient — or so it hinks until it observes how dependent it is on foreigners.
It begins then to fear the consequences to its political and cultural identity, and soon the rumblings of discontent are enacted into restrictive legisla tion, and in some countries into The trap in the latter is that

some countries are more dependent than they realize. They need foreign industry if they are to have jobs and homes and It can be shown too that the great industrial corporations of the United States, Britain France, Germany, Italy, Sweden—and Canada too—are just as dependent upon less devel-oped countries. Growth is the name of the game the world over, and even-

ually the local market is too small for a growing company It needs foreign sales and often it needs foreign resources too if it is to show sustained growth. There is enormous pressure from industry to create one world for business, to break barriers to world trade and world development. This, it is claimed, is the route to economic prosperity and even perhaps to peace.

In pursuing this goal, great pressure is exerted in the United States by multinational companies who seek freedom of action. And, of course, they actively pressure their foreign hosts for favorable treatment

In some instances the pressure can be exerted quite forcefully because the host country— the nation itself—is weaker than the foreign corporation with which it deals. Canada intends to apply the criteria of self-interest to future takeovers of its companies b foreigners, but it does not, it seems, intend to otherwise restrict future foreign investments. Nevertheless, its action is indicative of the concern being shown around the world as cor porations invade each other's ase countries. There are many multination al companies, but there are relatively few effective mul-


