

# There's Hope the Pest Will Go

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gov-ernment scientists say they have scored what could be a major breakthrough in the con-trol of disease-bearing mosquitoes without the use of DDT or other chemical pesticides.

Agriculture Department scientists, who directed the research, say the use of tiny parasitic worms which bore trolling the insects.

The tiny worms, called nematodes, are being field-tested by the U.S. Public Health Service in El Salvador and by the World Health Organization in Taiwan and Thailand,

the development of a low-cost method of mass producing a species of nematodes, Reesi

mermis nielseni, which attack only mosquitoes.

The production system was developed by the Agricultural Research Service at Lake Charles, La., by Dr. Harold Chapman, laboratory director, and Dr. James J. Petersen, entomologist, with help from Dr.

William R. Nickle, an ARS ne-matologist at Beltsville, Md. The procedures are described in the May issue of "Agricul-tural Research," a magazine published by USDA. At present, DDT is the cheapest and favorite pesticide for controlling mosquitoes in ma-

The larvae develop from eggs and, if they survive, turn into adult mosquitoes which then can carry many diseases, including sleeping sickness or encephalitis as well as malaria. Because of the specialized circumstances involving the

ARS scientists say, however, that mass production of the worms will enable man to spread them over large areas artifically, much the same as chemicals are applied now. Preliminary investigations indicate that about 1,000 nematodes are needed for each square yard of surface area to

## Teachers and Board Accept Many Items

The Coventry Federation of they must notify the board by Teachers (CFIF) and the Board May 15.

In the area of teacher efficiency ratings, electronic devices may not be used for evaluation or ratings, but may be used as a teacher procedure. The present contract states that electronic devices may be used only if requested by the teacher.

After any formal evaluation by a school principal or superintendent, the evaluator and teacher will hold a conference at the school where the teacher is employed, rather than at a time and place mutually agreed upon.





### Our Might-Have-Beens

This is one of those periods in the Vietnam war when, while we can do nothing more than wait to see whether somebody else is going to drop the other shoe, one might as well engage in the fanciful exercise of avoiding the worst that may be ahead by the process of altering the

Way way back before the first American dollar or the first American uniform appeared in South Vietnam, the law these columns would have tried to make apply would have read something as follows: "The United States shall not try to play any role in any other country it cannot play under the auspices of the United Nations."

That, by requiring that even our first economic aid to South Vietnam would have to be channeled through the United Nations, would have eliminated the first and most relatively innocent purpose American policy had in Vietnam - to make it a showcase example of what American financing and know-how could do for a backward country. And that fanciful law would have decreed that the only way American uniforms or weapons of any kind could enter South Vietnam would have been at the order of the United Nations Security Council or Gen-

No such law was in effect, and the United States did go into South Vietnam, first with its dollars and its economic help, and then with its uniforms and weapons and military personnel.

After this had happened, these columns would then have favored the following policy: "That the United States forces in South Vietnam shall confine their role to one of trying to establish and then defend positions which would preserve the geographical and political integrity of South Vietnam, and shall, in that process, do no fighting unless fired upon or in any way direct their own military activity at targets outside South

If we could have had such a policy, we would probably still have a few hundred thousand men in South Vietnam, maintaining this guard watch against attack, denying success to any aggressive moves on the part of the enemy, but we would also probably have some hundred thousand less wounded and tens of thousands less killed. And we would have had, if this could have been our policy and our action, no such terrible division at home over the issue of Vietnam, no such terrible destruction of the life of a countryside as our military conduct in Vietnam has involved, no such lack of support and understanding from other nations.

Vietnam itself."

There is always something tragic about one's might-have-beens. In this case, the final tragedy is not that we missed honoring United Nations jurisdiction and principles at the very start, and not that, after our entrance on our own, we failed to take a purely defensive stance. The final bitter tragedy is that those who did at least have such mighthave-beens for the past really have no equally persuasive alternative for the American policy of the moment, as it is being enacted. There might have been good solutions, at such moments in the past. We defy anyone to describe the

good solution for the problem as it is now shaped. But if we were to try to come as close as we could, we would have to hope that somebody would wake up and galvanize the United Nations and send it to our resall the golden glow.—MASSACHUSETTS AUDUBON SOCIETY
