Generally, two jets operate together in using the laser bombs. One is armed with a laser gun that spotlights the target with the light ray. The beam is narrow, like a rope, and does not widen as a spotlight would.

The second jet drops the bomb, which is fitted with a mechanism in its nose that homes in on the light ray. U.S. officials say the margin of erofficials say the margin of er-ror for a laser bomb is five feet or less, while a "dumb" con-ventional bomb dropped with normal trajectory has a margir of error of 150 feet due to the

plane's speed and altitude and wind conditions.

The inter-guided bombs are generally 2,000-and 3,000-pound blockbusters used on bridges that range in width from seven teet to more than 50. Official point out that it would be most difficult to knock out a seven-foot-wide bridge with a bomb

150 feet.

Among the major targets reported destroyed by these laser bombs was the Thanh Hos "Dragon's Jaw" bridge, 80 miles south of Hanoi, on May 12. The bridge, 56 feet wide and 540 feet long, stood throughout the 1965-68 bombing despite reported attacks by more than 1.

The Debate Everybody Lost The most interesting thing about what was called a great debate between Senators Humphrey and McGovern turned out to be the persistence with which the participating newsmen seemed to be pursuing the theory that it was their particular mission to expose Senator Mc-Govern's radicalism, following which his candidacy would evaporate, leaving the more familiar, more dependably political Humphrey in charge of the California

The newsmen seemed captors of the theory so often expressed in "Inside Report" on this page - that Senator Mc-Govern has been riding high only betaken. So they undertook, in the course of the "debate," to present, to the voters of California and the nation, the "real Senator McGovern."

We suggest some news for the newsmen. The unpleasant news - unpleasant not only for them, but also perhaps for the entire nation - is that the voters of California and the nation may very well know all about Senator McGovern, and that they don't care if he is far-out and unsafe by normal political standards.

As for what we think may be good for the nation, that is something else again. From that angle, what the "great deern and Humphrey ought to be transhere with sixteen-ounce gloves, while the Democratic party starts all over again in its search for a 1972 nominee.

### Big Scenes

Those of us who have let some inner shudder keep us away from those big hit movies which reportedly glorify mad orgies of senseless violence are being warned that we may not have to go to a movie to encounter such an experi-

We may merely be going about some holiday spending in a shopping center, as were three people now dead and eight who were wounded, down in Raleigh on Memorial Day.

The three are dead and the eight are wounded because a 22-year-old youth previously known as a "quiet boy" stood in the crowd, shooting at anyone who moved, and then, at the end, taking his bullet for himself, so that he never had to live long enough to confess a motive for his action.

Or we may merely be traveling, and have become part of one of those airport crowds, as were some 25 killed and 80 wounded at Tel Aviv last Tuesday.

The 25 are dead and the 80 wounded because three gunmen took their automatic rifles and some grenades into the crowded passenger terminal and then proceeded to turn the terminal into a bloody slaughterhouse. The gunmen were Japanese. What brought them into the Near East, on such a mission, may be discovered, if the one who is still alive corroborates the claim of Arab extremists that they arranged the

For the insanity which designs and carries out such events the important crowning touch is, we suppose, the complete innocence and non-involvement of

The more senseless the killings, the more artistic a movie they make, or imi-

ing them, the more satisfying, to the inanity, the sight of their blood.

There is, in the business of comment to peril greater than that of trying to take a limited number of specific happenings and use them to formulate some sweeping generalized conclusion. So we do not conclude. We merely ask. Does mybody else begin to suspect that civiliation may be evolving in the wrong direction? Are we going to look back, soon, with nostalgia and envious regret, at those comparatively civilized days when, if we killed, we at least had some kind of reason for attacking some particular life? When the same kind of thing starts happening in all parts of the world it the same time, is it merely coincidence, or is it part of some trend only the movie makers know
