DR. LAWRENCE E. LAMB Nosebleeds Are Common in Youth

By Lawrence Lamb, M.D.

Dear Dr. Lamb—What can root tell me about nose-hieding? My 7-year-old has hom quite often. Now I am about to climb the walls. I have had her to several, specialists and they all seem to say the same thing: she will outgrow it, don't let her pick her nose and buy her a cool air humidifier because her nose is too dry.

One doctor cauterized her nose wice, but says she is too young to do this too often. They all told me that when her nose bleeds, to either pack it with cotton or apply pressure of something else, but they don't understand the way I feel seeing her nose starting to bleed and just when I really start to panic over all the blood she is losing, it will stop.

What really can be done, and what can I give her to build up her system from losing all the blood?

Dear Reader—The doctors you have seen have given you very good, bound advice, which is usually what is recommended for this problem.

Most bleeding from the nose or pressing the soft tip against the head part and pinching the nose it often helps stop bleeding. Cold water also helps. In some cases if there is a superficial blood vessel near the end of the nose, it can be contentrated and this will control future bleeding.

DDT-Wise It's One World

The United States government, by formal decision from the Environmental Protection Agency, has now proclaimed an almost complete ban on the use of -DDT, effective Dec. 31.

Friday, June 16

This ban is becoming United States policy because of our fear of long-range dangers to the health of birds and beast and man - dangers which descend from the fact that DDT never loses its toxic properties, but keeps passing them along, sometimes in cumulative style, through the various processes of nature.

While we in the United States are banning the use of DDT because of its longrange danger to health, the World Health Organization is steadfastly refusing to ban it in the rest of the world.

The World Health Organization's refusal to ban DDT is founded in its concern for the short term health of the

It fears the immediate and tragic loss of life which might occur, through the undeveloped world, because of the decline in food production and the possible spread in epidemics which would be threatened if DDT were called off its

concern, here in the United States, and the often imperative short term concern in the rest of the world, has to be rethe ways in which this is one world, whether anybody likes it or not, is when it is a DDT world. No one has been employing DDT to grow crops or kill bugs down in the Antarctic, but the penguins there are gradually collecting more and

more DDT into their systems. If the dangers from DDT are as real as our own government now judges them to be, we are not really going to protect ourselves by any mere ban on its origi

nal use within our own borders. Likewise, if the dangers are as real as we think they are, any continuation of the use of DDT in the rest of the world cannot be tolerated by anybody ourselves, or the World Health Organization, or individual governments any-

where, just because it is going to be difficult and expensive to employ the same kind of substitutes we are going to get along with in this country. And the scientific evidence of the tendency and direction of the long range influence of DDT is now sufficient to decree world wide urgency about it, even though it may be that there has not



Many of us have already begun to receive the computer written letter, for purposes of salesmanship other than politics. The mark of the computer letter is that, for all its obvious artificiality, it nevertheless manages to include some touch which seems to reflect some knowledge of the recipient as an individ-

In politics the computer letter can be employed as a follow-up to telephone or door to door political canvassing, or as a fund-raiser. And results where they can be measured, as they certainly can in fund-raising, are said to be miracu-

The political significance of the computer may be temporary. But its skills as a letter writer are certain to be refined and improved and made even more sophisticated, and this, we think, is high good news, especially to those of us who normally find maintaining correspon-

dence a difficult and onerous chore. Even the least of us now may, as soon as he can afford a computer, maintain a wide circle of pen friends while, at the same time, creating possible volumes of wit and philosophy to be published later.

The moment in which the computer is proving fiself the potential answer to the correspondence problem is also the moment in which it first appears as the kindly helper in another problem which has been driving some people crary.

This is the problem of leisure time, which has been folsted upon an unprepared humanity by the rapid development of a technology which can produce all we really need in a short work

A selected group of especially sophisticated computers have now begun the merciful task of programming leisure time for those who find themselves helpless and demoralized because they have so many hours in which they can't go to fects itself, be able to do what the computer says, and have a good time.

New Abortion Law


Connecticut has a new law against abortions which is not substantially diferent from an earlier statute on the books for 112 years. It meets the insis-tence of Governor Meskill that a strong, anti-abortion measure be adopted to r place one which was held to be unconsti-

Although the new law satisfies the demands of the Connecticut Catholic Con-ference which lobbled extensively for the bill, the measure is regarded in some quarters as no more than a stopgap to fill the vold left by court rejection

Except for its preamble dedicated to protect and preserve human life from the moment of conception", it is little changed from the old law. Indeed it is difficult to see how a court can find any egal distinction between the two. The new law will be appealed by a group known as Women vs. Conn.

A less stringent measure might stand a better chance of surviving a court test. Even an escape clause which would have permitted rape and incest victims the option of legal abortion was stricken This raises the thought that some leg islators, caught on the controversial

sue , may be hoping the new law will also be held unconstitutional. Meanwhile, women who really want abortions need travel no farther than New York City where therapeutic abortions are available under the law. -

Youth Sent To Jail In **Drug Case**

Thomas F. Lynch, 19, of East Hartford, was given 2 one-year jail sentences, suspended after 90 days, and put on probation for two years by Judge Joseph A. Adorno yesterday in Circuit Court 12 at Manchester.

"I want to make sure you have something haveing over "I want to make sure you have something hanging over your head—to make you think twice," Judge Adorno told Lynch, who had pleaded guilty to two counts of sale of controlled drugs.

Atty. Robert Farr of Hartford, defending Lynch, asked the judge to consider that the youth had already spent 50 days in jail swalting disposition of his case.

Atty. Farr also asked the judge to consider that the amount of drugs involved was very small worth (about \$11) d that Lynch had a job wait-

ing for him.

Judge Adorno, after reading the pre-sentence investigation, noted that Lynch had been found guilty of similar charges last year. "If he had been incarcerated the first time," the tudge said. "he wouldn't he judge said, "he wouldn't be ding here now. "These young men just don't

believe until they're behind bars," Judge Adorno added. Lynch was arrested by Vernon police April 27 as part of a 12-town roundup of suspected drug pushers investigated by the Capitol Region Crime Squad. Lynch was originally charged with eight counts of possession and sale of drugs. He pleaded guilty May 25 to two counts of sale, and the other counts were noised by Prose-cutor John Lombardo.
