McGovern's Handicaps-Assets There is no sign that the McGovern orces themselves realize, any more than do the various recognized leaders of their party, or any more than do the arious commentators of the nation, the unique advantages which have been pressed upon them, at least temporarily, by the nature of their convention victory. The McGovern people, like everybody else, probably consider these factors obstacles and weaknesses which they must

work hard to overcome. The list of these temporary assets, which the McGovern strategists themselves will probably scheme to throw away, begins with the fact that Senator McGovern got his nomination without the support of organized labor, and over the outright enmity and condemnation of George Meany. That circumstance alone ought to be worth a few million votes, many of them from people who work for wages.

The next temporary asset for the Mc-Govern nomination is that it was achieved without the support of such a recognizedly wicked big city boss as Mayor Daley of Chicago, and, to tell the truth, without the support of most of the operating in the Democratic party. Being free of such bosses, if McGovern should stay that way, might mean more votes than the bosses themselves could ever deliver to him.

Thus free of the stifling embrace of organized labor and of the wicked domination of the big city bosses. Mo-Govern candidacy had the good fortune to run, even in the hours of its triumph into lovely demonstrations of discontent on the part of some of the wilder hippies who were supposed to be his most enthusiastic workers, and who, by their accusations that he had sold them out in order to reach safer political positions, launched a public impression that they didn't have him in their knapsacks af

While he was safely in the glow cast upon him by these three estrangements, from Meany, from Daley, and from some of his own hippies, Senator McGovern was, of course, the perfect paragon of a candidate and, in such a moment, probably in the strongest position his candidacy will ever achieve.

But, although he and his new politics strategists have had a few shrewd moments, we doubt that they realize that such supposed handicaps in their campaign should really be construed to be We doubt that the McGovern strategy

will be content with itself until it has made every last effort to placate Mr. Meany and flatter him into some kind of cooperation, and until it has created some facade of party unity which reaches out around Mayor Daley and other traditional machine-type bosses, and until it has reassured all those wonderful hippies that the candidate is still really, in his heart, as way out as they want

To such degree as the McGovern campaign is successful in such endeavors it will transform itself from a campaign with an unorthodox chance of winning into a campaign with an orthodox certainty of losing. That may be a service to the nation,

in that it helps bring about the reelection vert its mission. of an Administration which deserves the Two surface issues divide the arrirmachance to bring its own positive programs closer to completion, but it will hardly be a service the McGovernites intend. They emerge from their convention at a peak, but they themselves will be afraid of the altitude and seek lower, presumably safer levels. We suspect that we now begin to watch

Wings Don't Always Make Angels We all had a great instinct to believe that, because they had learned to fly like gods, there was something god-like about our astronauts to the moon.

> They are still mortal. This is disclosed by the news that the three astronauts of Apollo 15 last July have been officially eprimanded because they smuggled up to the moon and back some 400 specially stamped and canceled envelopes in addition to the official number they were supposed to carry, and because about 100 of these went into the commercial market where they brought a price of \$150,000, which was originally supposed to go for the benefit of their families.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration says they themselves had second thoughts about this, with the result that they themselves or their families never got any profit out of their transaction. And officialdom is eager to offer the following explanation: "Astronauts are under extreme stress in the months preceding a flight to the moon, and their poor judgment in carrying the unauthorized covers must be considered in this light."

Most of us are not interested in condemning or prosecuting the astronauts in question for thinking up and executing such a scheme. It is merely that now we know, in sadness, but in some relief, that, even when he goes to the moon, man still has that touch of the rascal in him, and will never be quite the angel, no matter how splendid his wings.

The Public TV Bogey

It may be true that public, noncommercial television reflects the attitudes of the American university-liberal-anti-Vietnam class. (Of course, it also carries the conservative viewpoint via William F. Buckley and his fellow National Review editor, William Rusher, who debates on the "Advocates.")

But even if the orientation of public television is liberal and all those other things the Republican administration and Southern Democrats can't abide. . * this is no reason to try to stunt its growth - which is the clear danger if public television does not get the funds it needs because of Mr. Nixon's veto of the \$155 million appropriations bill.

We prefer to think of public television not as the creature of the liberal class, but of the educated and inquiring populace in America. There must be some platform for those who are curious about how to improve public life to test their ideas out. Where but with public television did

The charge that public TV is New Yorkdominated shows both a phobia over the Eastern Establishment and an ignorance f its nature. It is not an Eastern Establishment, since its members circulate freely among Midwest, West Coast, as well as Beston - New York - Washington settings. The "members" of this group are better identified as intellectual than as liberal or conservative. It includes significantly, not just those who are now iniversity students or teachers, but the professional class of Americans, college rained businessmen, and even college trained military officers.

The trend of history, with so many young Americans now heading for higher education, with evidence of a vast disenchantment with mentally unchalenging commercial television output. shows the demand for what public television offers is going to increase steadily. It's a good investment for Con-

strued as glossing over the need to make sure public TV, like commercial TV, does not use its potential power for overtly political ends. Objectively still should govern in all news media. Perhaps the debate in Congress over the eanings of public TV content serves a useful purpose if it compels public TV's management to watch lest it sub-

Did He Miss Political Bonanza?

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) -One big city Democratic mayor says Republican Gov. Thomas J. Meskill has lost a golden chance to pick up "some political clout" by not using the \$30 million state treasury surplus for direct aid to municipalities. "Even if we got \$1 million in revenue sharing from the state we could reduce our property tax by one mill. The people would go bananas and think the governor is the greatest guy to ever come down the pike," Wa-

Meskill had announced that the state finished the fiscal year June 30 with a surplus of about \$30 million and that this could be used to roll back the sales tax from 7 per cent to 6.5 per cent.
