and held 13 more Iraelis hostage in their living quarters.
The Arabs, who had boxes of explosives, threatened to kill The Arabs, who had boxes of explosives, threatened to kill
all the hostages unless 200 Arab terrorists held in Israel were released.
They first set a deadline of noon-7 a.m. EDT. Later a Weast German spokesman said an extension of the deadline was achieved in negotiations between the efrrorists and
