

BONN (AP) - The West German government says it is doing all it can to counter the threat o retaliation from Arab terrorists demanding the release of the three guerrillas held for the attack at the Olympics.

The Black September Palestinian group said in a broadcast from Cairo Thursday it would "deal Germany a heavy blow" i

"We will show the Germa imperialists, who dragged the honor of the great German people in the mud, what a heavy blow we can deal them if our comrades are not released and the bodies of our dead fighters are not returned to us," broadcast said. The spokesman for the West

German government, Conrad Ahlers, said "all imaginable and necessary" security precautions had been taken.

Earlier, the Interior Ministry said it had received word that terrorists planned to mail bombs to Jews in Germany in packages and letters for the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, which begins at sundown today. There are approximately 32,000 Jews in West Germany, concentrated in such large cities a Berlin, Hamburg, Cologne Stuttgart, Frankfurt and Munich.

There seems to be a lot debate going on about who is giving how much to whom in the current presidential cam-

This concern may have some minor bearing on the election but we feel it is being distorted out of proportion.

However cherished the concept might be to those of our neighbors who are partisan in their political philosophy; the fact remains that neither political party can or has ever waged a national campaign without substantial and large contributions from "fat cats" within the

There is a fallacy too that such large contributions will inevitably influence the candidates if they are elected. We can't speak for all "Fat Cats; but the few we have known over the years are too smart to expect to make deals on a national level. On the contrary they,

long before the common man gets on the band wagon, have studied the political candidates long and hard and if they decide to contribute it is on the basis of the man's whole track record, not what he might or might not be able

In other words, a large contribution to a candidate doesn't necessarily mean a deal has been made but on the contrary it means the contributor feels his inc terests are best protected if that candidate is elected.

Votes elect candidates and voters should be concerned about the fundamental issues of this campaign such as inflation, the war in Southeast Asia, are ill served as precious campaign time is taken up with what is essentially a side issue that has no bearing on candidate qualification - who is giving how

Report Token Release

The token release of three prisoners of war by the North Vietnamese is good news for their families and we rejoice

However the fact remains there are several hundred other American POWs languishing in prison camps. How many is not known for sure since the North Vietnamese have steadfastly refused to release the names of those they hold

Obviously the announced intention to release the three men is political and timed to influence the American public as the 1972 Presidential campaign begins in earnest.

We don't know how much propaganda

We cannot help feel that many, many, more American parents, wives and children of Americans listed as prisoners of war or missing in action in, Southeast Asia would be grateful and relieved of the heartache and uncertainly that now exists if the Government of North Vietnam would publish a list of prisoners and the status of their health.

Clearly the North Vietnamese could reap a larger harvest of international goodwill from such a humanistic action than it can expect from the token release of three men.
