SAIGON (AP) - South and North Vietnamese forces were locked in savage, Quang Tri today, field reports said. It was the third straight day of heavy fighting there. South Vietnamese marines have made no progress since Tuesday when a company of about 200 men fought their way into the southeastern corner of the 19th Century Citadel. Associated Press correspon-dent Holger Jensen, reporting from the front, estimated the South Vietnamese held only

about two acres of the 50-acre Lt. Col. Do Viet, a spokesman for the Saigon command, said marine reinforcements got into the Citadel, but field reports said these were replacements for casualties. Major Step Forward

The Manchester Board of Education adopted on a trial basis for the 1972-73 school year an administration-student developed plan for two-way representation on the board and the student assembly at Manchester Senior High

The students will have two representatives sitting in on board sessions and while they will not have the legal right to vote on board issues the plan allows for discussion participation. A member of the board will be designated also to sit in on student assembly sessions whenever possible.

The goal is improved communication which the plan's rationale calls its primary clients and takes note of the school's to take more aggressive steps to prepare young people for citizenship participation since the voting age has been extended to 18 year olds.

However, in this trial period in and continue-it is incumbent on the students to select their representatives carefully so that there will be communication and participation and not merely token presence. The board too should seek out of its membership a representative to the assembly who has not only strong board experience but also an empathy for the students and their problems and views.

The plan is not a sure-fire solution to the communications gap between the school officials and the students but if both groups will approach and use this new avenue of opportunity it can and will be a major step forward in the Manchester school system as it has in

We will be watching with interest in the coming months this experiment and wish it success for in this complex age we live we can no longer accept, if we may paraphrase an adage, that students should be seen and not heard

Be Alert To 'Bargains'

For years consumers have been told to buy the brands you know from the firms you know.

And for years consumers and that includes all of us find it hard to resist a bargain. We all brag about those "good buys" or "good deals" we got because it is flattering to all of us to be good Yankee horse traders.

Conversely it is rare for any of us to admit we might have been "taken" by someone a little sharper than we were.

The result is that we look for bargains and because of the general integrity of our local business and service people, we do get to save money from time to time on items offered at legitimate bargain prices. More important locally purchased goods and services are backed up by the seller who is interested in you as a steady customer and he knews that this depends on your being asatisfied customer.

Unfortunately, there are in our free enterprise system, "fast buck" artists and "fly-by-night" firms who are always offering some fantastic bargain by mail or via door-to-door solicitation. One Manchester Evening Herald reader has called to our attention a firm

which conducts via the mails a contest reports the puzzle is simple and her 'second prize' was a \$200 check good toward the purchase of a \$289.50 sewing

This reader did what every other person being offered a similiar "bargain" gimmick should do. She checked with the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection in Hartford and found out a warning has been issued on this firm's gimmick, She was told the sewing machine, although priced at \$289.50, was probably worth \$69.50 thus the \$200 "second prize" check was come-on gimmick to fool the
