But actually, doesn't it seem logical to reason that elections are decided by the undecideds, and in good part at the moment of entering the polling booth? There are a whole lot of diehards,

Democrats and Republicans, who probably wouldn't vote for Jesus if he represented the other party. They are in the kitty of their party's "counted"

They don't need any appeals or arguments. They don't heed any appeals or arguments from the other side. They vote "right" whatever.

But let's consider the undecided voter. A lot of them-maybe most-are undecided as they enter the polling booth. They have last minute thoughts could." Rising Meat Prices

to the effect that the "best way to a man's heart is through his stomach." In the current campaign this is being applied by the candidates to the voters. While the various indicators seem to indicate a general holding of the line on prices, food prices continue to climb and this not only gets to the voter's

heart but also his pocketbook.

The administration has taken a few steps to curb food prices. Last spring, import quotas were lifted on meat in an attempt to stop rising meat prices. But this was the least objectionable action it could take politically since the high demand in Europe for meat has driven prices there higher than importers could expect in the United States.

The administration also "jawboned" with the top people in the major food chains to get them to use some restraint in holding down food price rises.

The irony is that as wage and price controls in the non-food sectors of the economy take hold and cut back to a degree, the inflationary trends of recent years, this also frees more disposable income for the consumer to use on food. Thus the old law which economists of any school, old or new have not been

able to repeal, comes into play. This is reflected in higher prices for the more choice meats for example while poultry seems to be relatively for Sen. George McGovern, while continuing to criticize the administration for its failure to resolve the problem of increasing food prices, to avoid it in his price-control plan. Speaking for the

South Dakota senator on the plan, the chairman of the McGovern Committee on Economic Policy is reported as stating "McGovern's control program wouldn't touch food prices either because they are too volatile and too closely tied to demand and supply.

This does not mean rising food prices will no longer be an issue but means the political appeals will be to the heart rather than the stomach since it is apparent that neither candidate wants to go the route of direct controls on food prices from the production to retail

A visit to the meat department reveals that while there are those of us with steak appetites for the 1972 campaign, we may have to accept a chicken in every pot instead of sirloin on Sundays. That is until demand for chicken drives the price up where hamburger is againcompetitive in the family kitchen.

It would appear the wise maiden of today will set her sights on chicken lovers instead of beef eaters if she is going to reach a man's heart through his stomach - economically.





#### Court Orders Resentencing For Speck

SPRINGFIELD, III. (AP) The Illinois Supreme Court has ruled today that Richard Speck, convicted of murdering eight nurses in a Chicago townhouse. must be resentenced.

Speck was sentenced to die in the electric chair in June 1967 but the U.S. Supreme Court ruled a year ago that the Circuit Court jury which tried him was improperly impaneled and voided the death penalty.

The high court remanded the ease back to the lower courts for resentencing. Meanwhile, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled June 29 that the death penalty constitutes "a cruel and unusual punishment" and

was barred by the U.S. Constitu-The Illinois Supreme Court had awaited the U.S. court's rule on death penalties before deciding whether to send Speck's case back to the Circuit Court for

The jurors who tried Speck in Peoria were barred from sitting on the jury if they said they had moral or conscientious objection: to imposing the death penalty.
