

Youths Get Full Rights On Sunday

On Sunday, Oct. I, the age of majority will be lowered in Connecticut from 21 to 18. allowing 18-year-olds and over to participate fully in the economic and legal processes of the state's society, in addition to the

Connecticut was one of 15 states in 1972 to lower the age of majority. The same action was taken in 1970 and 1971 by eight The new law entails major legal and ethical obligations for 18-year-olds, in addition to the

rights it grants them.

While it is true they will be able to consume alcoholic beverages and to be permittees for the sale of alcoholic beverages, it is also true they no longer will be entitled to the protective annonymity of probate courts. While it is true they will be able to obtain financial loans and negotiate personal contracts, it is also true that parents or guarobligations.

And, while it is true that 18year-olds will be able to marry without parental consent, it is also true they no longer will be considered minors within the context of the welfare laws and no longer may be classified as dependents for the purpose of receiving family benefits.

A law signed concurrently with the Age of Majority bill, but which became effective months ago, permits 18-year-olds to hold elective or appointive municipal office. The privilege does not apply to state office.

### New Farm Wage Minimums Begin Sunday

HARTFORD (AP) - The hourly minimum wage for Connecticut agriculture workers goes up from \$1.61 to \$1.70 effective Sunday, and jumps to \$1.85 Oct. 1,

The minimum wage for minors, those 14 to 18 years of age, climbs from \$1.37 to \$1.45 per hour Sunday and to \$1.57 in one year.

State Labor Commissioner Jack A. Fusari estimated that during the peak summer months, approximately 17,000 adults and 21,000 minors are employed by Connecticut agricultural con-

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) -The U.S. Department of Agriculture reports that approximately 4,200 acres of woodland in Vermont were defoliated this summer by gypsy moth caterpillars.

The USDA's report said that was 3,410 acres more than were damaged in 1971. Officials of the department's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service said the gypsy moth was as much of a problem as

ever, even though the total number of acres defoliated throughout the Northeast decreased this year.

## Countdown Under Way For Confident Red Sox

BOSTON (AP) - The countdown is under way with the Boston Red Sox, confident but not cocky of winning the American League East title with less than a week to go in the four-way dogfight.

"We're going to win it," veteran slugger Reggie Smith said flatly Wednesday after helping the Red Sox protect their first place lead in a 7-5 victory over the Milwaukee Brewers.
