To be more precise, it has been virtually untapped in recent years by scandals in Washington and other high places not because we are bruised and numb; but because we have long ago learned to distinguish between true moral outrage which transcends partisan outrage which is really what you are talking about isn't it?

Every election we are asked to turn "the rascals out" regardless of who is in power. The partisan outrage exists and will continue to exist because no politician worth his salt can ignore the desire of certain groups within his party for old-fashioned, down-to-earth politicking which traditionally calls for a certain amount of "mud" tossing.

In assessing your concern for the electorate's moral outrage capacity, we feel you were really talking to your own party for you cannot really expect us to believe that the opposition party faithfu would carry this torch for you anymore than Mayor Daley would lead a clean-up crusade in Cook County.

We suspect there is a rising moral outrage in this nation that will ultimately transcend partisan outrage which comes to the fore prior to each election. This is reflected in the rising numbers of the electorate who choose to "unaffiliate" or espouse to be independent; who may contribute to their church, synagogue, or favorite charity with generosity and regularity but not give a dime to a partisan candidate or party; or who, this really concerns us, do not register to vote or if they do, do not vote
