Secret Peace Talks Imminent

Ponder Tax Cut Session

HARTFORD (AP) Democratic leaders of the 'lame duck" state Senate are considering a special tax cut session that would be held in

about two weeks.

President Pro Tem Charles
T. Alfano and Majority Leader
J. Edward Caldwell said they would meet today to discuss the

House Speaker William Ratchford, who has the power to reconvene the House, said he was still not sure whether any tax cut could be passed in the aftermath of the election.

But Alfano and Caldwell indicated they would try to do what could be done to cut state taxes before the current General Assembly goes out of business and is succeeded next year by a legislature controlled by the Republicans.

Ratchford and other House leaders wanted to cut the sales tax by a full percentage pointbringing it down from 7 per cent to 6 per cent-before the

But the 19 Democratic state senators, who compose a bare majority in the upper chamber, had differing ideas about the kind of cut to be made and nothing happened in either the

Odegard continued. "An elected mayor has to respond to the people to keep his job each election. That's where his loyalty lies. It's not necessarily true that a manager excells in professionalism. He, like a strong mayor, must rely on trained department heads and other assistants. The competition involved in running

North Vietnamese Oppose Changes In Draft Agreement

PARIS (AP) - A new round of secret Vietnam peace negotiations was imminent today, but North Vietnam in advance rejected any changes in the draft cease-fire agreement worked out by Henry A. Kissinger and Le Duc Tho of the North Vietnamese Politburo.

Xuan Thuy, the chief of North Vietnam's delegation in Paris, told the weekly session of the semipublic peace talks: "We resolutely reject all the pretexts put forth by the United States and Saigon to demand modification of the substance of the agreement."

He repeated Hanoi's persis-tent demand that the United States "immediately sign the

The chief modification demanded by Saigon, a provi-sion calling for the withdrawal of all North Vietnamese troops in South Vietnam, was repeated today by South Vietnam's representative at the session,

Nguyen Xuan Phong. U.S. negotiator William J. Porter said: "Each of us is aware that the restoration of peace in Vietnam is approaching. Each of us is equally well aware of the efforts being made to refine and perfect the accomplishments of the negotiation so that a settlement fair to all will result.

In a brief prepared statement to the meeting, Porter avoided any reference to substantive issues but urged the Communist side to avoid "exaggerated rhetoric and unfounded charges of bad faith."

He declared that "our discussions should be directed toward the goal of peaceful "The opportunity to decide toward the goal of peaceful whether or not a change is to be settlement, much nearer than we imagined only a few weeks

East Hartford Fire Damages Six Stores

EAST HARTFORD (AP) - A three-alarm fire destroyed or severely damaged six stores Wednesday on the Brewer Street Shoppping Plaza on Main Street, authorities said.

The first call came in at 6:30 p.m. from a fire house across the street from the shopping plaza and most of the towns firemen and apparatus responded, bringing the blaze under control about two hours later.

Flames from floor to ceiling engulfed four of the shops, while the other two were heavily damaged. The flames gave

off large clouds of smoke for hours. No serious injuries were

reported. Several hundred persons watched firemen battle the flames in the chilly evening, and motorists en route to see the blaze caused a traffic jam

on Route 2. Officials speculated that the fire started in the rear of Frank's Supermarket and spread to the stores on both sides. Frank's, the Brewer Barber Shop, Drug Town, Dan Dee Cleaners, were all severely burned, and Puritan Maid Bakery and the Brewer

Hardward were seriously damaged, firemen said. The shops were all in one building. Portions of the roof collapsed, although a large sign over the supermarket remained standing.

The supermarket, drugstore and bakery were open when the blaze started, and all customers and workers apparently escaped unharmed.

About an hour after the fire started one of the fire hoses broke, sending spurts of water into the air, and scattering spectators as the hose jumped around the parking lot

Seapark's Department Store, which shares the parking lot with the shops was not damaged. No estimate of the damage was available late Wednesday night. The supermarket was the

NEW HAVEN (AP) -Newsmen have no right to frustrate the administration of justice by refusing to divulge their sources of information, says Gov. Thomas J. Meskill.

'There is no such right, and there never has been, and I fervently hope that no law will ever be passed which would create such a right," Meskill told the Yale Political Union Wednesday night.

"If you know something that an affect the true dministration of justice, you are duty bound as a citizen to divulge it to the proper authorities on demand," Meskill declared.

Meskill, who when campaigning for governor in 1970 endorsed limited "shield" legislation, told the Yale students they could have their own press cards printed up with very little difficulty.





Election a Poser For Both Parties

Richard Nixon has been accorded a

Roman triumph. Just as the Romans commissioned a wreath-bearer to follow behind the hero of the moment and whisper, "Remember you are only mortal," so the American electorate has tempered Mr. Nixon's overwhelming presidential victory by maintaining the opposition party in control of both houses of Congress - as if to say, "Remember, this is our government, you are only one branch of it and your

power is not without limit." So lopsided a mandate for one candidate can also be seen as just the opposite, a lopsided repudiation of the other candidate. Political analysts will be kept busy for a long time trying to decide to what extent this election was the one and to what extent it was the other. There is much for them to chew on.

For instance, although Mr. Nixon carried normally heavily Democratic Cuyahoga County (Cleveland), Ohio, out of some 679,000 voters who went to the polls, 59,000 could not bring themselves to vote for either presidential candidate but cast blank

There is also much for the Democrats to ponder as they attempt to recover from the greatest presidential debacle in the history of the party.

Was George McGovern, as he suggested even in the hour of his defeat, merely a little ahead of the nation? Does he stand on ideological ground the majority of Americans are heading toward, perhaps by 1976?

Or was McGovern really four time years behind the times, campaigning actually against Lyndon Johnson as he tried vainly to ignite the issues of the Vietnam war, some vague, popular distrust of the government, and so

In short, was McGovern to the Democrats in 1972 as Barry Goldwater was to the Republicans in 1964, or have fundamental changes been made in the grass-roots makeup of the party which will never permit it to return to what it was before

As for the Republicans, the lesson of the congressional elections is plain enough. The party has a long way to go before it even begins to emerge as

But it is the result of the presidential contest that continues to amaze the very electorate responsible for it. And when all is said and done, it is hard to believe that all those votes could have been simply against George McGovern rather than for Richard Nixon and what he accomplished in his first term.

No caviling can detract from Mr Nixon's tremendous personal victory a victory made all the more remarkable for coming 10 years to the day after his famous farewell address to the press, and to politics, after being defeated in his bid for the governorship of California.

It comes as a jolt to realize that this national political scene for more than two decades - longer than the voting lifetime of a truly emerging majority

Now, with a mandate behind him dent, Richard Milhous Nixon faces the potential of greatness. Who would have believed 10 years ago that such a statement could ever seriously be

As he himself noted on election night, a majority doesn't mean anything; it's what you do with it. And, "the greater the majority, the greater the responsibility."

Richard Nixon must now chart the course of the nation through 1976. Most Americans will be content with something less than greatness, and will be happy if the last four years of America's second century are remembered as a time of peace and of wise and good leadership.

But, according to Arkin, Killanin told him, "They (the DOOC) can't give the games up because they weren't given

Killanin told Arin that, under Rule 50 of the Olympic Rules and Regulations, the Games were actually awarded to the USOC rather than to the DOOC, Arkin said.

Arkin said Killanin told him that if Denver were unable to salvage the Games by February, an alternate site would






