Influential members of the Democratic party would like to erase as easily as possible the traces of the stunning defeat of Senator George McGovern by President Nixon.

Those governors who were successful in the national elections despite McGovern's rout want his hand-picked national chairman, Mrs. Jean Westwood, to resign forthwith. Mrs. Westwood, the first woman ever to head a national party, has said she would fight efforts to oust her and believes she has sufficient support to win if the issue comes to a vote at the national committee meeting Dec. 9.

However, she faces formidable opposition and the party will suffer from an open fight. Already, members of the executive committee of the Democratic Governor's Caucus have called upon her to resign. They could adopt a formal resolution demanding her removal when they meet in St. Louis Dec. 13. Gov. Dale Bumpers of Arkansas,

one of the leaders of the ouster drive. said he didn't think it would come to that, suggesting Mrs. Westwood, "a gracious lady," might change her mind and retire without making a fight of it. / "

That may be wishful thinking on Bumper's part, although the handwriting clearly is on the wall and Mrs. Westwood is on the way out, if

only to serve as a sacrifical lamb for the party's mistake in nominating the weakest candidate in its history.

McGovern, anxious to keep position of leadership despite his smashing defeat, pleaded with party leaders to mark time until the election results can be fully appraised and urged the committee not to be 'too quick' in demanding change.

His voice isn't likely to carry much weight with the Democratic governors, who feel the election results speak for themselves, and that it is time to start a new drive under new leadership toward a majority for

## Burfoot Repeats as Five Mile Champ

### Outduels Vitale in Breaking Course Record 10,000 View Field of 430 in 28-Degree Weather

Tall, methodical, long-striding Amby Burfoot saves his best running performances for late in the year.

Running true to form, Burfoot came up with a super effort yesterday morning when he thrilled an estimated crowd of 10,000 by showing his heels to a record field in winning the 36th edition of Manchester's Five Mile Road

The 26-year-old, 140-pound, six-foot, one-inch schoolteacher bettered his own record of 22:34 set in 1968 with a clocking of 22:21.9 in the holiday trot which attracted 430 official starters, plus 75 unregistered post entries, in 28 degree temperature. Unlike a year ago when eight inches of snow and ice covered the course, the sun was at its brilliant November best during the running. There were 429 official finishers. The previous high was 383 in 1970. A grand total of 560 entries were received, also

and I was sure we were running ahead of the record. I figured we would slow down the last three but we didn't." "This was a fast running day, good cold weather," the former Boston


