By now, you have the idea.
Jack Nicklaus has made it. And has it made.
Yet the appreciation of Jack Nicklaus has gone far beyond adding machine tabulation.
So has his own appreciation of the game he plays.
"I think professional golf is a good, clean sport," said Jack in a moment of reflection at the Sahara Invitational, his most recent tournament. "One that's increasingly popular. You used to have only 20 guys making a good living at it. Now you have 80 to 90 guys. We haven't had any scandals or real problems."

There is a maturing satisfaction in Jack that doesn't diminish his zest for winning. A lot of it has to do with the way he looks. The golf galleries form an adulatory procession behind him the way they've done for Arnold Palmer.

By the quirk of the draw, he played three straight rounds with Palmer at the Sahara. Five years ago it would have been a tribulation. When he was on his way to a record-smashing Open triumph at Baltusrol in 1967, the crowd applauded his bogeys.

"When you play with Arnold," he said then, "you expect the crowd to be partisan." The golf mood has changed for him.

"There's no favoritism toward Arnold now," he said.

Dramatically, the gestalt is right for him. The whole of the present Jack Nicklaus conveys athletic quality. The drives go booming down the fairways as they always did, but behind them now is a man lean in the waist where there used to be an obvious bulge. The transformation occurred in 1969 when Jack and Barbara Nicklaus got on a trans-Atlantic plane after the British Open at Birkdale. He turned to his wife and said, "This is it."

The next day he started on a diet. "I told Barbara," recounted Jack, "'I can go home and gain 20 pounds in three weeks. Why not go home and ose 20?"

In three weeks he lost the 20.

"I did it for health reasons," said Jack. "I'd never been on a diet before. My doctor always said to keep my weight up where it was at. 'You'll know when you have to lose it,' he said. And I knew I was getting tired."

There was no magic formula in the weight loss. He borrowed a friend's "weight watcher" book and followed it faithfully.

"He not only lost the weight," applauded Barbara, "he lost eight inches in his clothes."

The trim look boosted his imagery and didn't affect his play. The last two years have been his most sensational. And opportunely.






