





Predicts Ambitious Goal For Women in Politics

In the half-century since they won the right to vote - and the concomitant right to run for office - women have never totaled more than a hand ful in the U.S. Congress.

With the defeat of Maine's Margaret Chase Smith, there will in fact not be one woman senator when the 93rd Congress convenes in

Yet within six congressional and three presidential elections from now - just 12 years - women will hold half the 435 seats in the House o Representatives and a third of the 100 seats in the Senate.

Or such is the confident prediction of Helen Delich Bentley, chairman of the Federal Maritime Commission and one of the ranking female officials in the Nixon administration. She bases her prediction on trends she sees among under-30 voters today.

A former newspaper reporter herself, Mrs. Bentley told a meeting of women journalists at the University of Minnesota that the role of women in the federal government has expanded greatly in recent years. For example, no less than 119 women have been appointed to topmanagement positions. These in-

In addition, she says, in the past 15 months 1,200 women have been appointed to middle-management government jobs in Washington.

These, however, are appointments. The goal of some 250 elected women representatives and senators in the 99th Congress in 1985 remains an extremely ambitious one. But if the goal is not achieved, it may be due in part to something else Mrs. Bentley

In her experience, she has found that men, especially young men, have more faith in the abilities of women

I have an insurance agency and my wife works for me on a full-time basis as my secretary. We file a joint tax return. When I file my self-employment tax return, how much of my wife's earnings are reported for Social

Security?

A. If you and your wife are not actual business partners your wife's earnings are not covered by Social Security. Net earnings so only to the covered by Social Security. earnings go only to the one who manages and controls the Q. I own and operate a farm.

My 16-year-old is working on a 4-H project. He will earn about \$800 from the project this year. Is he considered self-employed A. Yes. If your son is carrying out his 4-H activity by himself, he is self-employed. Since his net earnings will be over \$400 for the year, he must file an income tax return and pay the Social Security selfemployment contribution

regardless of his age.
Q. I recently purchased a small neighborhood store and I would like to know how to correctly figure my net ear-nings for Social Security. A. Count as your net earnings for Social Security the gross income from your trade or business, less all of your allowable business deductions and depreciation. The following binds of income descriptions. kinds of income do not count for Social Security credit: dividends from shares of stock and interest on bonds or other interest-bearing instruments business as a dealer in stocks and securities. Interest from oans unless you are engaged in

the business of lending money, tental from real estate unless you are a real estate dealer. Q. How do I report my self-employment earnings?

A. After the end of any year which you have net earnings of \$400 or more from self employment, complete the following forms, Form 1040 (U.S. Individual Income Tax Return), Schedule C (Profit or Loss from Business or Profession). Schedule SE

(Computation of Social Security Self-employment Tax). Send the income tax return and schedule along with your self-employment contribution to the Internal Revenue Service. File your calendar-year return on or before April 15 of the following year.





Agency.
Additional regulations are proposed for 1979 that could cut One of the first of the new regulations would prohibit discharge of excess fuel during engine start-up and takeoff as of Jan. 1, 1974. There also would

be a limit that would virtually eliminate visible smoke from such medium-range jets as the DC9 and the 727. An EPA spokesman, Robert L. Sansom, said Monday most pollution from aircraft occurs during ground operations. The agency said it is considering regulating pollution from aircraft engines during idling or

taxi time, possibly by requiring that some engines be cut of during such operations. Standards to limit emission of carbon monoxide, hydrocarbons and smoke would take effect for all new engines on Jan. 1, 1976, under the


