



Peace Is Subject Around the World

It's almost more than a citizen, if he has any interest at all, should be expected to follow without a

We're talking about the rash of international conferring now breaking out. And there is good reason for interest since the outcome should considerably influence the structure of our world for some time to come.

In Helsinki, representatives of 32 European governments plus the United States and Canada have gathered with moderate fanfare for what actually are talks about talks. preparing the ground for a foreign ministers conference on European Security to come in mid-1973.

In Geneva, meanwhile, the United States and Soviet Union have quietly begun SALT II, the second phase of their marathon talks on strategic nuclear arms limitations.

And in January, the two superpowers plus major NATO and Warsaw Pact allies turn to another East-West front, opening exploratory talks on reduction of military forces in Central Europe.

There are obvious similarities in the three events-they share the general goal of securing peace and they bring the powers that count most to that end, the United States and Soviet

Union, to the conference tables. But there also are significant differences, particularly in approaches to that goal.

In Geneva, the two superpowers are alone together, confronting each other and the danger to the entire world posed by their nuclear arsenals. SALT's first phase took 30 months to produce agreement on limiting antiballistic missile systems, the prohibitively expensive defenses against nuclear attack which both nations have begun to deploy. Phase two with a tougher problem-limiting much longer, possibly four years. Geneva is the ultimate in great power diplomacy, the dialogue between Washington and Moscow that has replaced their Cold War confrontation. And as such it is viewed uneasily by other nations. feeling shut out of deliberations vital-

ly affecting their security. The coming Central Europe talks on the other hand, might be called the son of Cold War. They involve the two alliances that were major products of postwar tensions. The issues are superficially military, limiting the forces of conventional warfare, but basically political. Success to any degree should reinforce the east-west bridge-building already well advanced by West German Chancellor Willy

In Helsinki, multilateral diplomacy is at work. Theoretically, alliances have been left at the door. Instead of choosing up sides, the nations are to speak for themselves on a common interest-the peace and security of the European continent.

Three approaches to securing peace: In Geneva, an exclusive dialogue of the two superpowers. In Central Europe, an accommodation between two military alliances. In Helsinki, a congress of nations.

What is to be expected, and from which approach? Expectations at this early point probably depend primarily

Idealists, and there are still some around, may look to Helsinki, hoping that in this debate of theoretically equal nations a new order may emerge through consensus.

Realists, however, are more likely to focus on Geneva. The world may be much changed in the generation since the United States and the Soviet Union confronted each other across the wreckage of the community of nations. But it is still a world in which offensive weapons-is expected to run power talks most effectively.





In the report, issued Tuesday, White said that an experimental program had convinced him that the non-professional "social service aides" are as effective as collegetrained social workers in increasing the self-sufficiency of welfare recipients.

Where do you start?

With a partial spending plan, suggests Dr. Elsie Fetterman, University of Connecticut Extension family economist. Although most spending plans cover a year, beginners should only try to deal with a few months at a time. Then when record keeping becomes easier,

 How much of your income is already promised to others?

List the name of each person or company you owe, and the amount of payment for the next month. This list may include rent or house payments, fuel, electricity, telephone, installment payments, etc. These are fixed expenses and are basic to most households.

Compare these total fixed expenses to the total income you expect next month. Your total income can be calculated by pay periods-monthly, bi-monthly or weekly. The

difference between these two figures is the amount of money you will have left for day-to-day

2. How many promised payments will you take from each paycheck?

If you are paid once a week, try to decide which fixed payments you will make each week. Some payments may be so big that you will have to save a little more from two than a little money from two, three or four week's funds. Also plan for payments that come only once or twice a

year-insurance, taxes, car license, etc. Then compare each weekly total to your expected income for that week. Subtract fixed expenses from ncome to find out how much spending money you will have each week.


