natural as sunshine and cheerful as a mountain spring Walter weathered dire overty in his childhood and si: years ago survived a life breatening heart attack. With background such as that, fatthau doesn't need anyone to tell him how to enjoy hi

present success.
"Life to me is funny, real numorous," he said at a uncheon at the new Park Lane hotel here. He was celebrating the completion of his most recent film, "Pete 'N' Tillie," in which he and Carol Burnett

"I don't know why, but life seems to make me laugh most of the time now. I try to have a philosophy for every specific moment, but it changes so rapidly I guess I don't have a general philosophy." Now 52, although he could easily pass for an athletic 40,

Walter reached the peak after a ong apprenticeship in both family when Matthau was only 3, he, his mother and a brother moved through a series of cold water East Side tenements

because they were unable t pay the rent. At 11, Walter was acting in a Yiddish theater at 50 cents a performance. During the intermissions he sold soft irinks in the lobby.

After earning six battle stars as an aerial radioman and bomber gunner overseas during World War II, he worked his way through acting schoo working as a floor scrubber and cement hauler. Slowly he became known as a

competent and conscientious craftsman in Broadway plays and as a Hollywood film villain. Then his 1965 appearance in the stage play, "The Odd Couple," made him a comedy sensation.





NEW YORK (AP) - O.J. Simpson of the Buffalo Bills, with a bit of help from the Washington bench, led a nine-player parade into the National Football League's 1,000-yard club this

It would have been 10 but for a fumbled pitchout. According to the final and official regular-season statistics released today by the league, Simpson led all ground-gainers with 1,251 yards surpassing Washington's idle Larry Brown in last Sunday's game against the Redskins.

Simpson went into the game 6 yards behind Brown's 1,182 but ripped through the Redskins for 101 yards and the NFL rushing title. Brown was kept out of the game, won 24-17 by Buffalo, because of a

slight injury. Also breaking the 1,000-yard mark-as the 1962 league record of six players tumbled- were Ron Johnson of the New York Giants with 1,182 yards; Larry Csonka of Miami, 1,117; Marv Hubbard of Oakland, 1,100; Franco Harris of Pittsburgh, 1,055; Calvin Hill of Dallas, 1,036; Mike Garrett of San Diego, 1,031, and John Brockington of Green Bay, 1,027.
