The nation's 33rd president died at 8:50 a.m. EST. His wife and daughter were notified at their home. Truman

Truman entered the hospital three weeks ago today and had been in a coma since early Saturday.

As his condition worsened Christmas Day, Truman's daughter Margaret Truman Daniel, returned from her home in New York. She saw him for about 20 minutes Monday night.

Truman had been vice president for only 82 days in the closing days of World War II, when he became president on the death of Franklin D.

During his eight years in the world's most powerful post, Truman set the United States against global communism, aiding countries that were threatened by the threat of Russian domination. One of the most momentous

acts of his presidency was to order the dropping of the

Truman was president in a the end of World War II, the domestic turmoil that accompanied return to peace, and the evolution of the cold war with Russia.

He was a blunt, outspoken Democrat who rose through a powerful, corrupt political machine from county judge to senator, becoming vice president in Franklin D. Roosevelt's fourth term. When Roosevelt died on April 12, 1945, Truman in office only 82 days — was sworn in as the nation's 33rd president.

He served nearly two full terms, then returned home to Independence in 1953, spurning what he called "fantastic offers to lend my name to this cause

For more than a decade thereafter he devoted his time to writing, some lecturing and a television series, and to the Harry S. Truman Library which

houses his papers and

But the infirmities of age finally took their toll of a man whose life had been one of great vigor and ebullient good health. After a tiring round of 80th birthday parties in 1964 he suffered a bathroom fall probably occasioned by a small stroke - and his public appearances became a trickle. In 1966, appearing thin and feeble, Truman gave up his daivisits to his office in the Truman Library, six blocks from his home. He cut down on

the number and length of his traditional crack-of-dawn walks, and finally abandoned them altogether. No Recluse Yet Truman was no recluse. He took drives almost daily with his wife Bess - to the grocery store, post office or the public library - content to wait in the car while she went about errands. Mrs. Truman, whom

he married in 1919, was only nine months younger than he. His was a graceful transition from the mightiest office in the free world to the life of "Mr. Citizen," as he titled the first of his three books.

"I don't want to hang around Washington trying to tell the next man what to do," he said. He maintained to his death a policy of not commenting on any matter concerning foreign

"He was a regular guy," says The Manchester Herald's circulation manager of former President Harry S. Truman. "He didn't put on any airs. He had the common touch and he made me feel right at home." Peter Cordera can attest to President Truman's

penchant for early morning walks. Codera accompanied him on his 5 a.m. walks around the U.S.S. Missouri for the two weeks the president was abroad.

It was in August 1947. President Truman and Gen. George Marshall were bound for Brazil, for the signing and implementaion of the Marshall Plan. Cordera was a member of the U.S. Marines detachment assigned to protect the president - to and from Brazil

"I'll never forget those walks," says Cordera. "It was just the two of us - the President of the United States and a corporal in the Marines. He never pulled his rank. He was truly an average American."



The Bushnell Memorial is going to undergo some very extensive remodelling in the fairly-near future. 



Characteristically of the man from Missouri, who first became president by the accident of death and later was re-elected overwhelmingly despite polls and naysayers to the contrary, Mr. Truman never in his lifetime apologized for making that historic A virtual unknown as a national

figure when President Franklin D. Roosevelt died, the former U.S. Senator soon took a firm rein on the nation. He forged ahead with the creation of the United Nations, he instituted the Marshall Plan to reconstruct war-ravaged Europe, he developed the keystone of American foreign policy in the Truman Doctrine, and eventually earned, though grudgingly, the respect of his political opponents for his handling of the presidency in those trying post-World

How we assess Mr. Truman today means very little however since history, as time passes and events arise, is an ever changing thing. But there seems to be agreement even today that Mr. Truman, contrary to earlier predictions, will rank as one of America's greater presidents.

And in assessing this man and his impact on our lives, we tend to dwell on the major decisions and actions he had to take in meeting his duty as he

part of the American presidency. There is something about the job that brings out the best in a man, no matter how mediocre his track record may have been prior to his ascension to the job. This has been particularly true in times of national stress and turmoil for it has been only in times of relative peace and tranquility that we have really had mediocre presidents.

Mr. Truman, like Lincoln, was a man of humble beginnings and yet rose to the challenges of the duties imposed upon him by fate and a troubled

America now mourns the passing of a great American and the measure of that greatness is Mr. Truman himself since he was not born to greatness but rose up to it when his sense of duty to his country demanded it.

In Harry S. Truman there was an embodiment of that elusive American ideal of the "common man" who can and will do the right thing at the right time when the chips are down.

His epitaph, and a summation of this fundamental American commom man philosophy, might well be his famous retort to long since forgotten critics of some of his decisions: "If you can't stand the heat, get the hell out of the kitchen."

They deny flatly that such deductions are simply to be regarded as taxes in the same way one views an income or a sales tax. The funds collected from more than 90 million workers and self-employed go into trust funds, and are not to be used

Social Security is "insur-ance" they say, because it shares the same basic prin-ciples as group insurance and private pension plans.

As with those, it rests on a financial plan agreed to ahead of time. As in those arrangements, a person is earning credits over his working career, toward pro-tection against loss of in-come when he retires, be-comes disabled, or dies. His Social Security benefits become payable on a pre-determined basis when those

events—the insured risks— occur. And those rights are legal and enforcible.

Thus Social Security Com-missioner Robert M. Ball as-serts that Social Security can hardly be called "a tenuous social agreement," as one critic has charged.

Analyst and critic John
Brittain quotes a government lawyer who once
argued in federal court that
no such right to benefits was
earned by paid contributions.
That lawyer's brief, offered
in a deportation case, is today thought of as "misguided" at best, and clearly
inaccurate.

Moreover, Social Security officials quote a Supreme Court decision in the socialed Nestor case, in which the justices ruled that the system "may be accurately described as a form of social insurance content." insurance enacted pursuant to Congress' power to spend money in aid of the general welfare."

On the matter of whether the first Social Security tax-is "unfair" to low-income workers, Ball says that when

average earnings under Social Security are \$3,600 a year will get benefits equal to 64 per cent of that level. If his wife also draws benefits, the total will be 97 per cent. A man and his wife in an instance where the man's earnings average was \$9,000 will draw benefits equal to 71 per cent of that average. A man whose earnings average under Social Security are \$30,000 will, on the other hand, get benefits coming to just 14 per cent of that level. Adding in a wife's benefits will makes the property of the still makes the property.


