# IRS Wars Against

Income Tax 'Pros' A severe shaking out is in prospect for professional tax preparers, who

have sprung up like Topsies in recent years thanks to the ever-simplified but always labyrinthine Form 1040. Last year, according to the Internal Revenue Service, more than half the 80 million returns filed by American taxpayers were prepared by someone

other than the taxpayer - to the tune of \$640 million in fees. It wasn't necessary, says the IRS, which this year will lose the taxes on that \$640 million since fees paid to tax

preparers are deductible. Neither was

it entirely on the up and up. In a spot check of returns prepared by some 3,200 private firms during 1972, every other return was unacceptable, says the IRS, either because of careless or inaccurate work or actual cheating.

Thus it has declared a kind of war on the private tax services by, among a number of things, bringing back Short Form 1040A and by announcing that IRS offices will provide complete, free tax preparation service for any taxpayer who wishes it.

Because the standard deduction has been raised from 10 per cent to 15 per cent and the income ceiling abolished for eligibility to use 1040A, it is estimated that 32 million taxpayers will elect to file the short form in 1973.

All of which, of course, affects the legitimate tax-preparation firms along with the not-so-legitimate, the competent as well as the incompetent, and the big ones with branch offices probably even more than the little ones consisting of a couple guys doing

Henry W. Block, president of H&R Block, Inc., the giant in the field, questions the wisdom of the IRS in trying to specialize in tax preparation. Better, he says, to divert more personnel to auditing returns, which brings \$10 to the U.S. Treasury for every dollar spent.

Block also recommends that all tax preparers, large and small, be required to register with the IRS so that their "very essential service" can continue under some form of government recognition and





# We are planning increases in the rates for some out-of-state calls.

The American Telephone and Telegraph Company has filed a new schedule of interstate rates with the Federal Communications Commission which increases charges for some customer-dialed calls during weekday business hours, for some operator-assisted calls, for some person-to-person calls, and for WATS(Wide Area Telecommunications Service). All rates for interstate Long Distance calls you dial yourself without operator assistance In the evenings, at night, and on weekends will

remain unchanged. The new rates for Long Distance calls become effective on January 22, 1973. The new rates for WATS become effective on March 13. 1973, unless suspended by the FCC.

Here are the provisions of the new interstate rates:

1. Some of the rates for station-to-station calls you dial yourself without operator assistance from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, will be increased five cents or 10 cents for the first three minutes. 2. Some of the rates in all time periods for

operator-assisted station-to-station calls (that includes credit-card, collect, thirdnumber, hotel-guest, and coin telephone calls) will be increased five cents for the first three minutes. 3. Some rates for person-to-person calls in

all time periods will be increased five cents or 10 cents for the first three minutes. 4. The rates for each additional minute on some calls in all time periods will be raised in a range from one cent to five cents. 5. Interstate WATS rates will be increased

about two percent. 9 6. Rates for station-to-station calls you dial vourself without operator assistance during evenings, nights, or weekends will remain the same.

Interim rates and supporting data have been filed with the Federal Communications Commission. The increases for Long Distance calls have been authorized by the FCC on an interim basis to be effective January 22, 1973. The FCC will conduct additional hearings on the lawfulness of the rates, and FCC rules permit any interested persons to appear and participate.

This will be only the second general increase in interstate Long Distance rate levels in almost 20 years. During this period, in spite of inflation, interstate Long Distance rates have been reduced repeatedly. Even with this increase, the level of the new rates will still be below the 1953 level. Yet in those 20 intervening years, the cost of living has gone up more than 50 percent. The new rates are designed to increase total revenues from interstate service by about two percent.

Despite what ski reports you hear via radio or read in the newspaper, they are probably inaccurate at the present Although the temperature was ideal for snow-making

Skiers, a good note to remember. If traveling a long distance to a resort, first call the area and specify that you are out-of-state and ask the conditions. Usually they are pretty accurate then.

# McCormack Named To Pick Up Eagles

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Big Mike McCormack has a big job in trying to make a winner of the National Football League's Philadelphia

If that isn't enough for McCormack to contemplate, the Eagles suffered their worst defeat in the 39-year history of the team, a 62-10 drubbing by the New York Giants, a game in which fired coach Ed Khayat said the

Is McCormack apprehensive?

"I expect to win next season," said the husky former Cleveland Browns tackle, who made the Pro Bowl squad six times while clearing the way for former NFL great Jim Brown. "I'm an eternal optimist," McCormack told his first news conference as Eagles' head man.

McCormack said he has the

authority to run the Eagles' football operation, make trades, final say on the draft, anything connected with player personnel. He said he will ask for advice, but the final say is his. McCormack played his college football at Kansas and was the first York Yanks. He later was traded to Cleveland and played eight seasons under Brown. He worked in insurance, and as a part time assistant with the Kansas City Chiefs

pefore joining the Redskins in 1966. McCormack said his impression o the Eagles, based on three games against the Redskins last season, was that the team had as good a defense as the Skins faced all season up to the Super Bowl game against Miami. He plans to go to work on the sick offense starting with the Jan. 30 player draft.



# Sanderson Image Tarnished of Late

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - "Derek Sanderson has some proving to do," says the attorney who got the controversial hockey player a contract settlement with the World Hockey Association's Philadelphia Blazers worth a

reported \$1 million. The attorney, Bob Woolf, agreed that Sanderson emerged from the bizarre, unprecedented Blazers' negotiations with somewhat of a tarnished image. The hockey team bought up Sanderson's 10-year \$2.4 million contract and gave him his unconditional release. Woolf declined to disclose what the settlement was

worth, but did say, "it was awfully high." "In some respects," said Woolf at a news conference Wednesday at which Sanderson's cash settlement was announced, "he (Sanderson) didn't act the way he should have and I was somewhat disappointed in him. In reflection, he (Sanderson) doesn't think he acted properly. He perhaps didn't do some things he should have done. His attitude was not what it should have been. Derek has some proving to do and I think he feels that way too." Woolf hastened to note that he wasn't downgrading his client, that Sanderson was a standout hockey player with a
