Our Dependence On Oil Imports

States is dependent upon oil imports. Like every other industrial nation: America runs on oil. Homes are heated by oil and when a shortage occurs, as it has this winter, many households and industries face

The administration has lifted all restrictions on oil imports for home heating and increased all petroleum imports by nearly a million barrels a day. The action followed an earlier suspension of Western Hemisphere

preferences for oil imports. These steps might assure adequate supplies of heating oil for homes and business for the remainder of the winter and will remain in effect

through April 30. However, retiring George S. Lincoln, director of the Office of Emergency Preparedness, warned that domestic refineries must increase production by 5 per cent to meet the demand. The highest estimate of available imports is 350,-000 barrels a day, he said, compared to the need for 3.8 million barrels on a "cold day." This indicates that Midwesterners, who have been
