NEW YORK (AP) - The American entry of Lake Placid, N.Y., into the four-way competition for the host role of the 1976 Winter Olympics is welcome and valid, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has assured the U.S. Olympic Committee (USOC).

Officials from the small Adirondacks resort village, many residents of which have nurtured cases of "Olympic fever" for years, were en route to Montreal Thursday for a flight to Switzerland when a USOC official discounted earlier reports that the IOC was not inclined to accept the

U.S. entry. A site to replace Denver as the 1976 host is to be chosen by the IOC this weekend at a four-day meeting beginning today in Lausanne. The Lake Placid delegation flew there to present its bid personally

Lake Placid was accepted by the USOC Wednesday as the official U.S. entry - competing with Innsbruck, Austria; 16 French communities near Mont Blanc and Tampere, Finland.
