



How To Hold Down Prices

The government is hopeful that voluntary controls on wages and prices will work. If they do, it will not be because people are less greedy but because of the "club in the closet"-standby powers to stop or roll back inflationary advances.

This could prove to be messy as well as controversial. Manifestly, it would stir up the bitter antagonism of workers denied inflationary wage

United Transportation Union members have shown their disregard for the national interests or the life of the company they work for-the Penn Central Railroad. They walk off the job in protest against the railroad's plan to eliminate 6,000 jobs over a five-year period, saving \$90 million a year. They were aware it might be a death blow to the company, already bankrupt, and looking for federal aid to keep running.

The strike brought quick emergency action in Congress to halt the strike for 90 days but no move as yet on the basic problem of how to get the railroad back on the tracks of operating in the black.

A national transportation policy that avoids periodic strikes and works better than the Taft-Hartley provision for 80-day cooling off period is urgently needed.

One union leader, Al Chesser, told Congress the strikes was not "a labor issue" but a forceful way to get the attention of Congress to the urgent need for a definitive plan to save the
