



### Why Support Lutz Junior Museum?

The following guest editorial is by Theo R. Badenhuizen, director of the Lutz Junior Museum in Manchester.

A museum is often considered a luxury item to be axed from the budget when money is a little tighter However, one thing you can't afford to ax is time spent wisely. This is true for everybody but especially for youngsters who are in their formative

Why is time at the Lutz Junior Museum and its programs wisely spent? There are quite a few reasons.

First, it is a community-oriented non-profit service organization. This means that is exhibits are relevant to today's needs and can be visited free of charge from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. every day, except Monday. Exhibits range from a horned owl, which is the largest owl in the world, through animals that may be petted gently in the "Critter Crib", to games with designs and numbers, fashions and mechanics which lend themselves to creative manipulation by fascinated children and challenge the magination of all visitors. Live demonstrations help to hold the public's interest each Saturday.

Behind the scene is one of the largest loan schemes in Connecticut with more than 600 loan boxes available free to all teachers in the Manchester public schools, dealing with important aspects of life's values from faraway cultures to conservation of the environment at

The Lutz Junior Museum extends its influence further by encouraging attendance at its many classes conducted for youngsters every season, utilizing its staff and many able volunteers. The most extensive of these is the Lutz Outdoor Lore in the summer at the 53-acre Oak Grove Nature Center. There is also a monthly television appearance on the Ranger Station called "Around the World with Lutz" as well as its longFar-ranging public programs are

constantly provided. The museum has had responses to its popular program on wolf conservation, presented in November 1972, from as far away as

A peak at the family-oriented programs to come reveals a trip to Manchester's waste treatment plant Feb. 24 to show the reality behind the solid waste recycling exhibit now displayed at the museum with the cooperation of the Manchester Public Works Dept.

March 3, a physical science Museum, is planned in the East Catholic High School auditorium demonstrating important principles and applications of electricity,

The Longwharf Theater will visit Manchester High School April 8, featuring two shows of "Jason and the Argonauts," top flight entertainment for all ages. There will also be a field trip to Barn Island in May to provide insight into the glacial history and important role of ecology of a saltmarsh, turning into real proof what has been only recent hear say for most of us about the importance of

All these public programs are free to members of the museum.



Though scouting is still interested in camping and outdoor living, the main emphasis is on citizenship. The scouts are also concerned about change and making the program important to today's boys (and girls!).


The month of February marks the 63rd

Cub scouting is still a family and homecentered program for boys who have completed the second grade and are 8, 9 and 10 years old.












### What is Boypower '76?



### **Super Sport:** David Thompson



### Lord Baden-Powell



He organized the Boy Scouts in Britain in 1907. Then years later, with the help of his sister, Agnes, he organized the Girl Guides. He was also a friend of Daisy Low, who helped found the Girl Scouts in this country. Baden-Powell was born on February 22, 1857. He died in 1941.











Yes, George Washington did wear false teeth. They were very uncomfortable and hurt his gums. The uppers were made from the teeth of a hippopotamus and the lowers from elephant's tusk or ivory. They were very badly stained from drinking coffee, tea, and wine and chewing tobacco. Many people in Colonial times had no teeth at all because so little was known about dentistry. 


George Washington was born on February 22, 1732 in Virginia. He started school when he was seven and stopped at age 14. Arithmetic was his favorite subject. He liked riding, hunting, fishing, boating and dancing.

He became a surveyor and made maps of Virginia. He then became a soldier and was a lieutenant colonel in the Virginia Citizens Army.

When he was 26 years old, Washington decided to become a farmer and settled down at his plantation, Mount Vernon. He married Martha Custis, a very rich widow with two children. Washington was a loving step-father.

He was chosen to lead the American army in the fight for independence from England. The war lasted eight long years.

Washington returned to Virginia and became a gentleman planter. He helped write the Constitution and was elected our country's first president in 1789. He served as president until 1797. He died of a throat infection on December 14, 1799.






