



The Dollar Drops Again

For the second time in a little more than a year, the dollar was devalued in the wake of heavy pressures in world markets as speculators poured \$10 billion into the money exchanges on the gamble that Japan's yen and Germany's mark would go up as the dollar went down. The gamble apparently will pay off.

The 10 per cent devaluation of the dollar in terms of gold proved that the dollar is no longer a firm foundation for the world monetary system. Supplies of monetary gold are inadequate to handle the volume of international trade and efforts to find a substitute for the dollar have not been

Treasury Secretary George Shultz said devaluation and other moves planned by the administration willbenefit the American working man, the businessman and the consumers. Devaluation will raise the cost of imports into the United States and lower the cost of American goods sold abroad. This should improve our competitive situation and help our chronic trade deficit.

But devaluation alone will not be enough, as Shultz recognized in saying the administration will ask Congress for legislation designed to enhance our bargaining power to lower trade barriers, to raise tariffs, and to set

All these moves are aimed at equilibrium in our foreign trade, with a reduction of foreign restrictions on American goods.

American tourists abroad, however, felt the immediate impact of a 10 per cent drop in the purchasing power of

the United States will be more difficult to discern. One of the first effects the consumer will notice will be higher prices on all those foreign

An oversupply of dollars abroad, plus fears of more inflation in the United States, caused the rush to sell dollars for marks and yens.

Shultz said Japan will float the yen, that is, it no longer will maintain a fixed rate of exchange with the dollar. It will rise now probably 10 per cent or

Fundamental reform of the world's monetary system is needed and the dollar crisis should make other nations, so long the recipients of America's unstinting help, realize the urgency. We have a right to expect their cooperation but it is up to us to put our own house in order.

The Smithsonian Agreement of 1971, which devalued the dollar 8 per cent, lasted only 14 months and its fixed parities are likely to give way to control by supply and demand, the age-old law of the market place.

The first in the American Arts series for 1973, the horizontal stamp pays tribute to a composer of some 400 songs. Gershwin won world acclaim in 1924 at the age of 25 with "Rhapsody in Blue," a symphonic treatment of jazz. It was stroduced by Paul Whiteman in a New York concert and has since been played by major

symphony orchestras here and in Europe.

Although his popular tunes had people all over the world umming and singing, it was Gershwin's serious efforts which brought him even wider acceptance. In addition to "Rhapsody in Blue" and "Por-gy and Bess," he composed "An American in Paris," "Concerto in F," "Second Rhapsody" and





With ecology in mind, a state egislature banned the sale of alligator skins within the borders f the state. In short order, a maker of men's shoes went to court with the following object

"This law is unconstitutional True, the state does have the power to protect consumers. But ere they are not trying to protect consumers. They are trying to protect alligators. That is be yond the scope of legislative au-thority." However, a court ruled that the easure was indeed within the



"Protection of animals," said the court, "is necessary not only or their natural beauty and fo biological study but (also) for the key role they play in the main-tenance of the life cycle." Not long afterward, a shoe dealer tried another line of attack on the same law.

"It hurts our chances of making a living," said the dealer. "It de stroys our property rights without due process of law." But again the court upheld the legislation. The court said the shoe dealer simply had no "prop-erty right" to begin with in the wildlife of a foreign country. These cases illustrate the lega ssues that have arisen out of e orts to preserve "endangered species." As a rule, courts have looked with favor upon such ef

Nevertheless, if the state may act on behalf of animals, it may also act on behalf of hunters. It mother case, lawmakers decid to introduce a special breed o deer into remote sections of the state-for the benefit of sports-

Overtime Rules Violated

HARTFORD (AP) - The state Police Department has been breaking rules and regulations by giving troopers time off instead of overtime pay, the state auditors reported Tuesday.

Also, state police officers above the rank of corporal have been given compensating time off although they are not eligible for any overtime compensation, either in time or in money, the auditors said. "Troopers up to and including the rank of corporal are eligible for overtime payments, while those above the rank of corporal are generally ineligible for any form o

compensation for overtime,' the auditors said. However, the auditors noted that a bill has been filed in the legislature which would allow state police to be given compensating time off for over-time work.

Also, the state Personnel Policy Board has been asked for its advice on how to apply the overtime regulations to state police "because of the special circumstances of their work," the auditors said.
