



The General Accounting Office, the federal government's watchdog agency, has announced a two-year study to investigate federal pay-setting machinery to find out if federal employes are not, in fact, getting more than their counterparts in

This is a worthwhile project for it should put to rest any nagging doubts about inequalities in pay for the same

The Hard Line Pays Off
