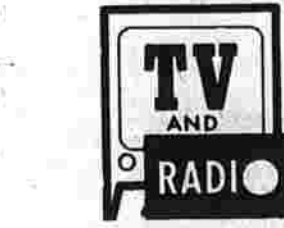


Celts' John Havlicek and Knicks' Walt Frazier Eye Action

Trevino Within Sight Of One of Prime Goals

RANCHO LA COSTA, Calif. (AP) - Lee Trevino is within sight of achieving two of his prime career goals. He had a one-shot lead going into today's third round of the \$200,000 MONY-Tournament of Champions. Once more he ticked off those major targets he has set for himself: "I really want to win this tournament," Trevino said after fighting gusty, shifting winds for a one-under-par 71 in Friday's second round.

"I consider this one of the most important tournaments in the world—maybe No. 4. You want to win any tournament you play in, but when you beat the champions of all the other tournaments, then you're a champion of champions.



Knicks Hold Trump Hand In Playoff Against Celtics

BOSTON (AP) - The New York Knicks held the trump hand in the National Basketball Association's Eastern championship playoff today when the Boston Celtics worried about the condition of super star John Havlicek.

The Knicks, confident and poised, gained the home court advantage while going up 2-1 in the best-of-seven series with a 98-91 victory Friday night before a packed crowd of 15,320 at the Garden.

While the Knicks were congratulating each other on a top defensive effort, the Celtics were hurling in more ways than one. The loss stung, and so did the post-game report on Havlicek.

The Boston captain suffered a right shoulder injury when caught in a pick involving New York's Dave DeBusschere and Bill Bradley in the third period, and was ineffective the rest of the way. He even missed two free throws with the Celtics trailing 92-85 and four minutes to play.

"I think it was Dave," Havlicek said. "It was a good play. I've been through a million picks like that, but we hit shoulders. I just couldn't shoot after that. I missed some decent shots and even two or three foul shots."

Helped out by his uniform jersey by a couple of writers, Havlicek said: "It's sore on top. If I had to predict right now, I'd have to say I couldn't play New York Sunday."

Dr. Thomas Silva, the Celtics' team physician, scheduled X-rays for today, but said examination showed no sign of a separation. He added that he is "always optimistic" and hoped Havlicek would be ready for the fourth game.

After wrapping shootout victories in the first two games, the two teams were ragged in the third encounter. New York moved in front 23-27 after one period and then capitalized on Boston's poor shooting for a 58-46 halftime lead.

PROVIDENCE (AP) - Most golfers find it tough enough trying to beat the hole, but Rick Holcomb tried to beat the clock at the same time and he failed on both counts.

After missing the world record for the fastest round on golf by more than 10 minutes on Friday, the winded Holcomb was not so dependent.

"I didn't break the world record. But I bet it's the New England record," he said.

Racing from shot to shot with only brief glances at the ball as he stroked it, the 20-year-old who boasts a four handicap when he takes his time, carded an 89 for the 6,400-yard long Griggs Golf Course. And it took him 39 minutes and 17 seconds.

The current speed record for an 18-hole course of more than 6,000 yards is 30 minutes and 10 seconds, set last year by Dick Kimbrough of North Platte, Neb.

In talking about the mark, Holcomb had to contend with the lengthy Griggs course with many difficult hills and had to play through at least six four-putts, which had not been cleared from the links.

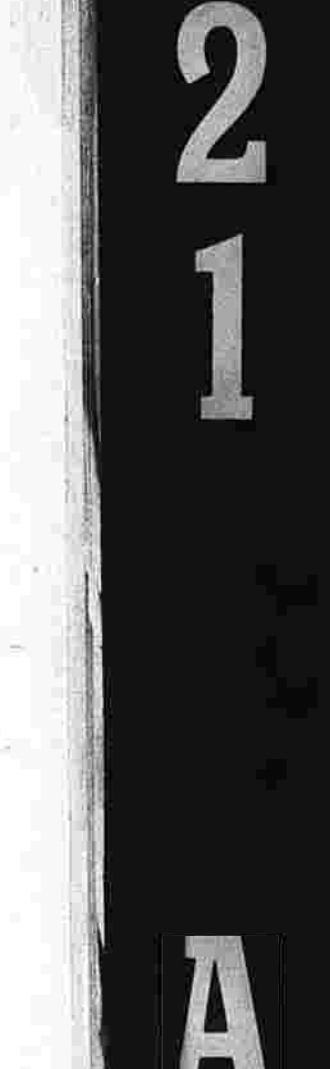

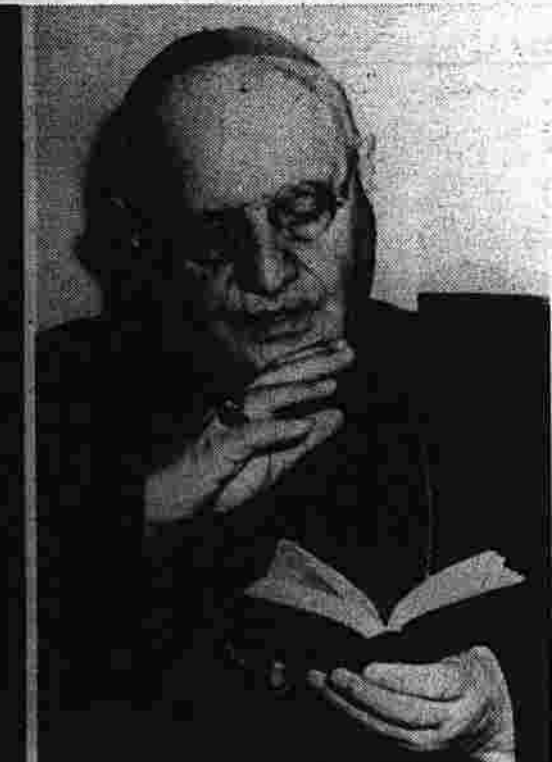
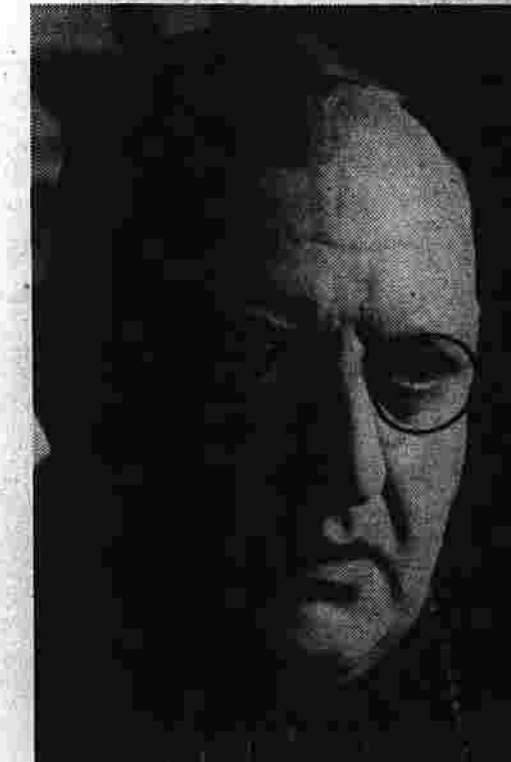
But they didn't. People thought of him as an actor. Clary made his debut as a young singer in France and has performed as a singer and actor ever since.

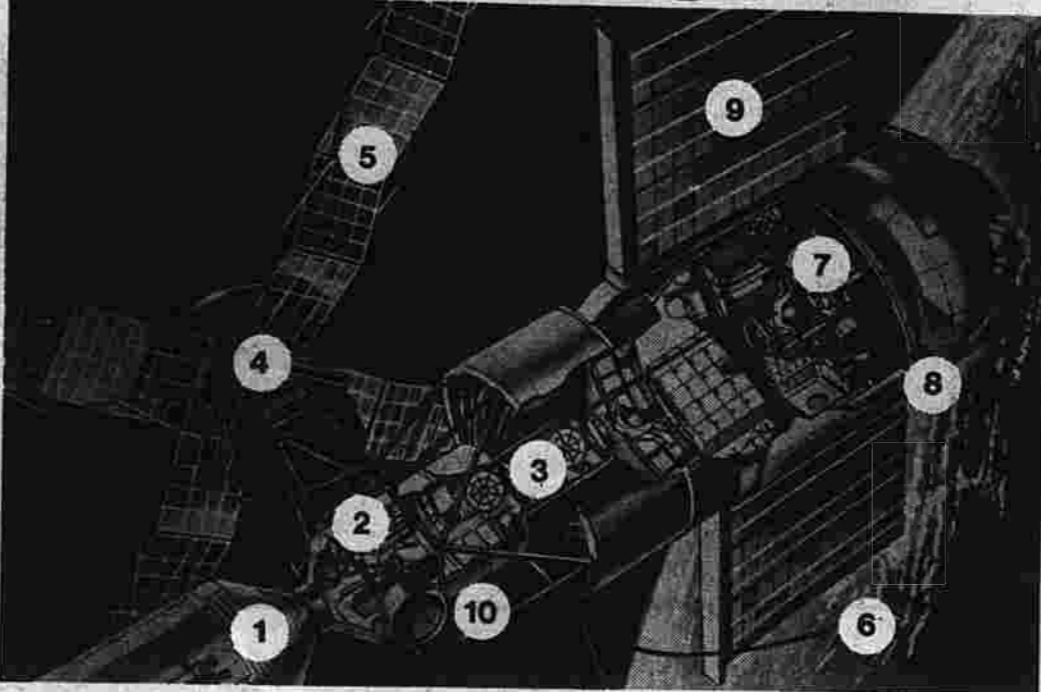

Skylab Launching Is Scheduled for Next Month

Skylab, our country's first earth orbiting space station, is scheduled for launching sometime next month. It will be placed into orbit about 270 miles above our planet.

The purpose of the Skylab mission is to gather information about the earth, the sun, man and space. About 60 experiments will be carried out.

Skylab experiments about the EARTH will help man learn about this planet's resources and problems, such as air and water pollution, flooding and erosion.

Skylab experiments about the SUN will tell man more about his most important source of energy. These sun (or solar) experiments will also tell us how the sun affects the weather.

Skylab MEDICAL experiments will increase man's knowledge about himself. For long periods of time, crews will be living under weightless conditions. How will this affect man's balance, heartbeat, circulation and sleep?

Skylab experiments about SPACE will find out more about the stars and the upper atmosphere. New machines for use in space and new methods to help astronauts to move around in zero gravity will be tested.

To carry out the mission, three different crews will live in Skylab during an eight-month period.

The mission will begin with the launch of an unmanned Saturn V, carrying the workshop which will automatically assemble in space.

Twenty-four hours later, the first astronaut crew will be launched in a command service module. This module will hook up with Skylab. The three man crew will remain on Skylab for 28 days.

Sixty days after the first crew returns, another crew will be sent up to visit the workshop. This mission will last 56 days.

The third and last crew will be launched about 80 days after the second crew returns to Earth. This visit is scheduled to last for another 56 days.



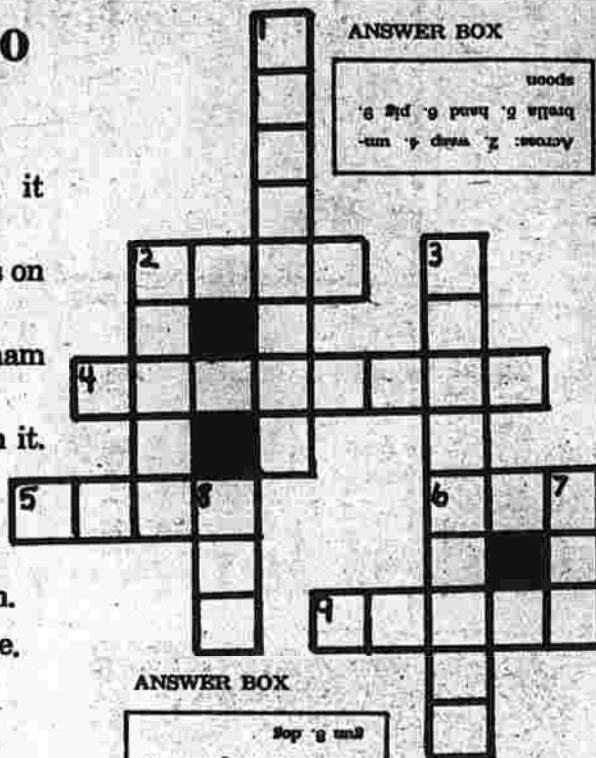
A member of the NASA research team tests a machine that will be used in Skylab to record the energy required for astronauts to do a measured amount of work in weightless conditions.

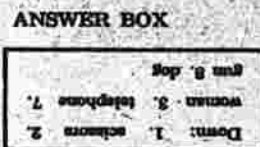

Conrad Kerwin Weitz

Prime crewmen for the first skylab mission are Charles Conrad, Jr., commander, Joseph P. Kerwin, science pilot, and Paul J. Weitz, pilot. Conrad, a U.S. Navy captain, was commander of Apollo 12 and has spent a total of 506 hours in space. Kerwin is a doctor of medicine and is a commander in the U.S. Navy Medical Corps. Weitz holds a master's degree in aeronautical engineering. This will be the first flight into space for Kerwin and Weitz.

Space Quiz-a-roo

What about water, food and clothing?

Water, food and clothing supplies will be stored in special places in the Workshop before the launch.

What will the astronauts wear?

For normal working and living in the workshop, the astronauts will wear cotton overalls over undershirts and underpants. These will be thrown away when dirty. They also will have a special space suit to wear for some inside experiments and possible emergencies.

What are some of the problems of living in zero gravity?

Keeping motionless becomes a real problem. Means of holding the astronauts down, such as a firehouse pole and handrails, will be provided. In zero gravity, the idea of up and down makes very little difference. It is as easy for the astronauts to stand on the ceiling as on the floor.

What about the air?

The air inside Skylab will contain the same amount of oxygen as the air on earth.

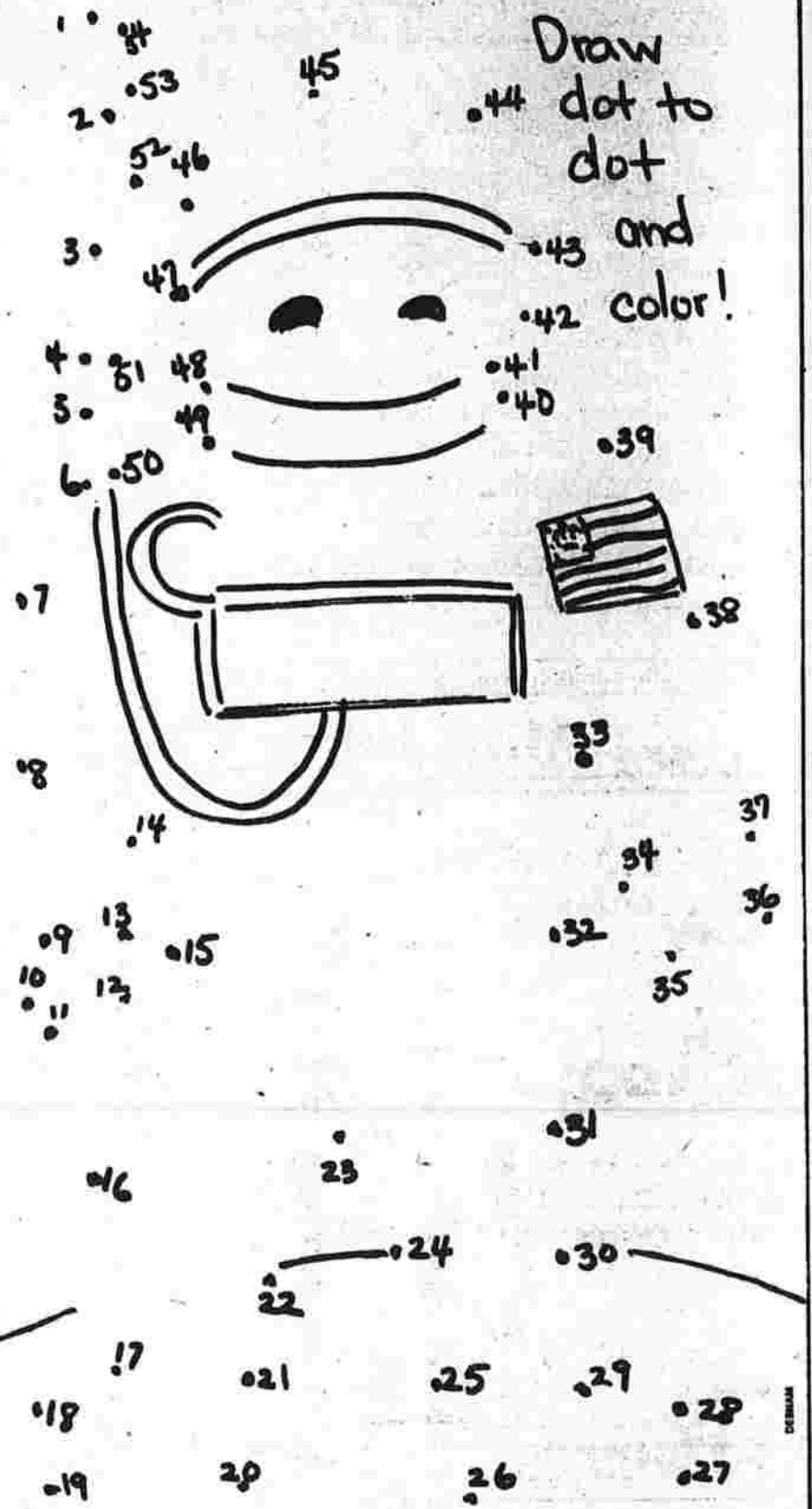

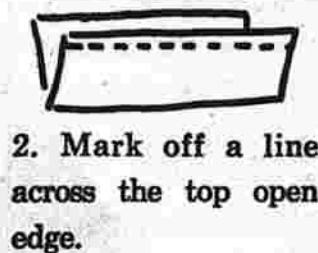

2. Mark off a line across the top open edge.

5. Open up the large sheet and weave strips in and out. No paste is needed if strips are woven tightly.
