



According to the story, some faculty members, each of whom is required to teach 12 hours a week, were scheduling their classes on Tuesday and Thursday and just working a two-day week.

"What we are trying to stop is the people who for personal gain or other non-professional reasons are working less than a five-day week," Harold Abel, president of Castleton State College, said.

His implication appears that some were probably taking advantage of the situation to moonlight.


His request will undoubtedly arouse some ire among faculty members who feel they are putting in a-full week although their classroom appearances seem to indicate otherwise and he recognized that exceptions could be

made for "scholarly work off campus during the regular work week."

Apparently Abel is extending that dictum of a couple decades ago by stating faculty members too should be spending a few hours each day in class preparation in ratio with the number of hours spent in class.
