PLEASANTVILLE, N.Y. (AP) - Reader's Digest says its newsstand price will be reduced from 60 to 50 cents in an anti-inflation effort starting with the July issue.

"This price decrease follows the steady growth in newsstand sales," the Digest said

The magazine, which originally sold for 25 cents an issue, reached the 60-cent peak in 1971. Two previous hikes led to other past cover prices of 35 cents and 50 cents.

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Nixon, acknowledging "apparently wide-ranging efforts" to cover up the Watergate scandal, says he intervened only to bar the FBI from looking into secret "national-security activities."

While conceding he is under heavy fire, Nixon said: "I will not abandon my responsibilities. I will continue to do the job I was elected to do."

Spokesmen for the major oil companies opposed the creation of a commission. The committee decided against giving the commission control over retail gasoline dealers. They concluded that normal competition would keep retail prices under control.

The governor and legislative leaders would appoint the seven member commission, which would remain in existence until July 1, 1975 unless a subsequent general assembly extended its life.

Connecticut Atty. Gen. Robert K. Killian spoke in favor of the anti-trust amendment, saying it would allow Connecticut to share information with the federal government, which is beginning to investigate reports of price discrimination by major oil companies.

Killian has been an outspoken critic of gas companies. Last month he subpoenaed 31 distributors for information about possible supply rationing by five major

A recent Superior Court decision forbids him currently from sharing information about such matters.

"We have literally been deluged in the last month or so with requests for information and assistance from other attorneys general who are taking or planning to take action along the lines we have already initiated," he said.







The President's reluctance to act on non-Watergate matters is what concerns us now. With a special Senate committee, a special prosecutor, a grand jury and an ever-probing press concentrating on the matter, the truth

will eventually be brought to light. To put all other matters in abeyance awaiting this outcome is probably hurting the country more than the Watergate scandal itself.

We do not envy the President in these trying times. We presume him innocent of involvement in Watergate and the attempted coverup until proven guilty.

The clear and present danger is not whether the administration has lost the confidence needed to govern but whether one issue, Watergate, serious though it may be, can bring the rest of government to a halt.

The test of our democratic system with its checks and balances is not in its purity but in its ability to function in adversity; whether it be corruption, medocrity, stupidity or what have you in any of the branches of Confidence in Mr. Nixon as a person

may have been shaken by Watergate, confidence in the Congress has been shaken in the past by their individual actions, and confidence in members of the Supreme Court has been shaken by decisions handed down but the system survived and will survive if we, whether we are in Manchester or Peoria, remember ours is a government of laws rather than men and get this message to the Congress and the

This nation has survived acandals before and can survive Watergate. Let's leave Watergate in the hands of those already charged with its investigation, and let's have the rest of the Congress and the President in particular, get on with the other, and more important, matters at hand.

If we read the temper of Main Street right today, the people are more concerned with what is going to be done to halt inflation, lower food prices, solve the energy crisis, and other matters than what happened in the 1972 campaign

To quote another President, who had problems too, "let's get the country moving again." As interesting as the Watergate detour may be, clearly it is time to get back on the mainline and deal with the many, many problems that have to be resolved and can be resolved regardless of the ultimate outcome of Watergate.

cent accurate in predicting what nonusers eventually used any type of drug.

The report added that

analysis was 67 per cent accurate in predicting which new narijuana users went to hard drugs - such as heroin, stimulants, depressants and hallucinogens-like LSD. The researchers said that in comparing data from nonusers and those already using drugs at the beginning of the study in 1969, the computer was able to sort out the two groups with 81 per cent accuracy using only the predictor information.

The report on developing predictive models for drug use was presented at the National Research Council-National Acadeny of Sciences meeting of the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence held at the Jniversity of North Carolina in







Nixon said in his latest Watergate statement Tuesday that the documents "must remain secret" because they deal with foreign intelligence matters. But Dean said he took them from the White House because they bore on Watergate and he feared their destruction.

Dean was fired April 30 in a White House staff shakeup that brought the resignation of Nixon's two top aides—H.R. Haldeman and John D. Haldeman and John D. colleges. Ehrlichman. On May 3, Dean filed a brief with U.S. District related documents that John





Q. I retired at age 62 and receive reduced Social Security benefits. My wife is 59 and has Security. She has a chronic kidney disease and at present is taking course of hemodialysis. Is there any way she can come? under Medicare?

A. Yes. If you are entitled to Social Security benefits, your wife and children will be eligible if they need hemodialysis or a kidney transplant. Contact your Social Security office about how to apply for this Q. I was hospitalized for two

weeks last month. Because of my condition, my doctor requested a private room for me. Will my Medicare coverage pay for my private A. Yes. Medicare can help

pay for a private room when it is medically necessary. Of course, the hospital will bill you for the first \$72 of covered hospital services - which is the hospital insurance deductible at the present time.

Q. I'll retire in a few months and start collecting Social Security retirement benefits. Will I have to pay federal income tax on these monthly benefits? A. No. You do not

have to pay federal income tax on Social Security benefits. Q. I just found some doctor bills from last year and was wondering if I could still send them to Medicare for payment. Can you tell me if there is a time limit on claiming medical expense from March 1972? A. Yes, there is a time limit. It's Dec. 31, 1973 for services received from Oct. 1, 1971 through Sept. 30, 1972. Q. Are prescription drugs covered under Medicare?

Q. I go to my doctor yearly for a routine physical checkup. Will Medicare pay for these A. No. Routine physical

checkups are not covered by Q. Are ambulance services covered by Medicare? A. Yes, if (1) the ambulance company meets Medicare equirements and (2) transportation by other means could en danger the patient's health.

Markoff, administrative assistant, teaches junior high math. Mrs. Campbell teaches Grade 3; Miss Krush, Grade 4, and Wallace, Junior high math According to Markoff, IMS is presents the elementar mathematics skills in a logical

sequence of separate steps which can be mastered by the child, for the most part, on his With IMS, the teacher sheds his role of "instructor" and assumes the new role of diagnosing, prescribing and evaluating the individual needs

of each student, he said. Individual success is a basic concept of the program, Markoff said. He added that IMS is neither a textbook nor a workbook but a sequence of separate laminated, reusable workpages which present the necessary elementary mathematics skills from a number of different angles. Included in the workpages are entertaining and interesting illustrations and stories, teacherdirected activities, student

projects and the application of manipulative devices, Markoff said. The child is provided with his own answer keys and is responsible for correcting those pages he has worked on. Since constant evaluation is an integral part of the program,

various IMS tests are provided. They include the initial screening device, placement tests, pre-tests, short skill check tests and post tests. The IMS program will be used in Grade 3 through 6 beginning in September. It is possible the program may include Grades 1 and 2 the following
