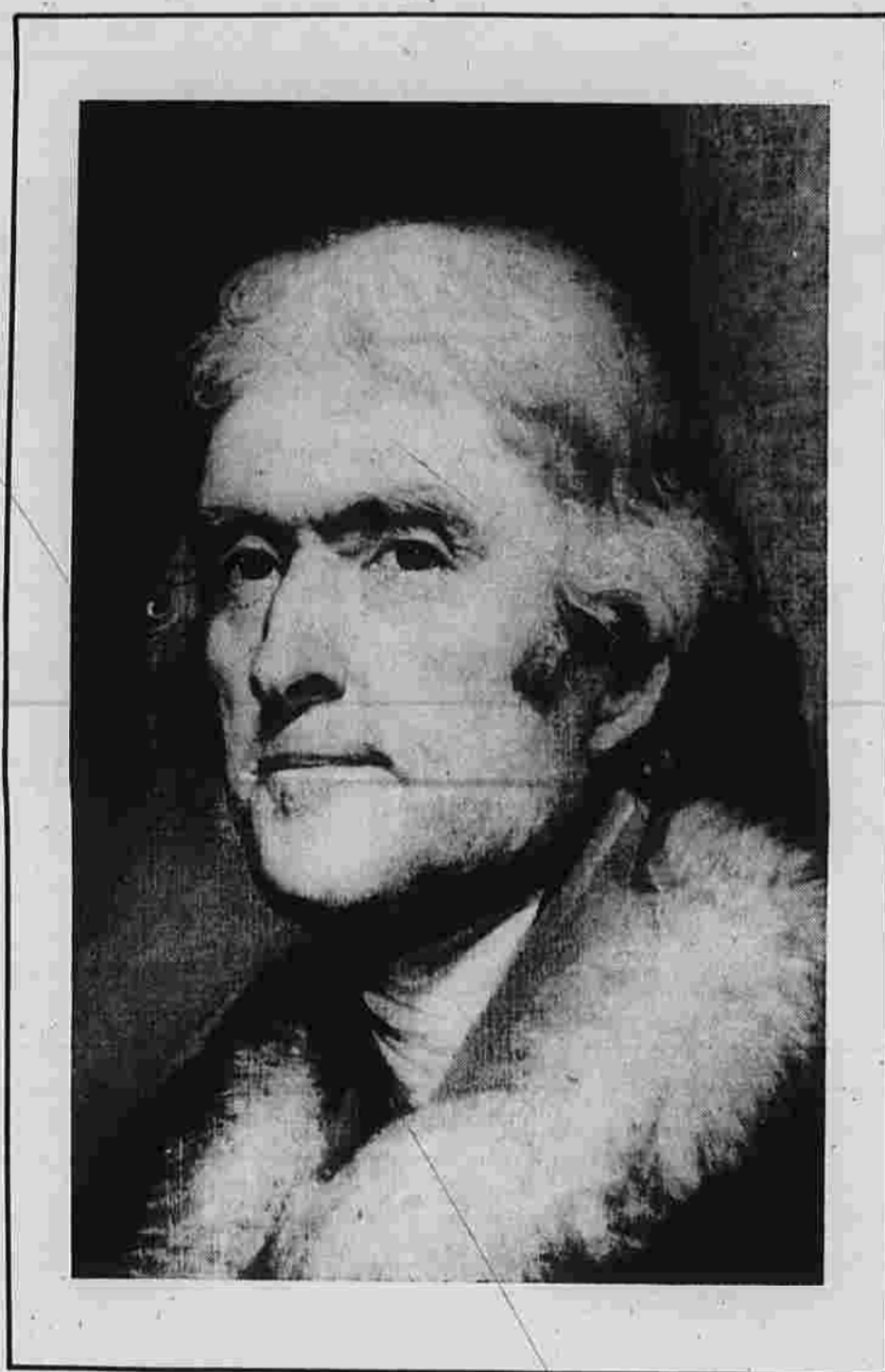

Consequently, when our freedom of the press is restricted, your free speech is also restricted.

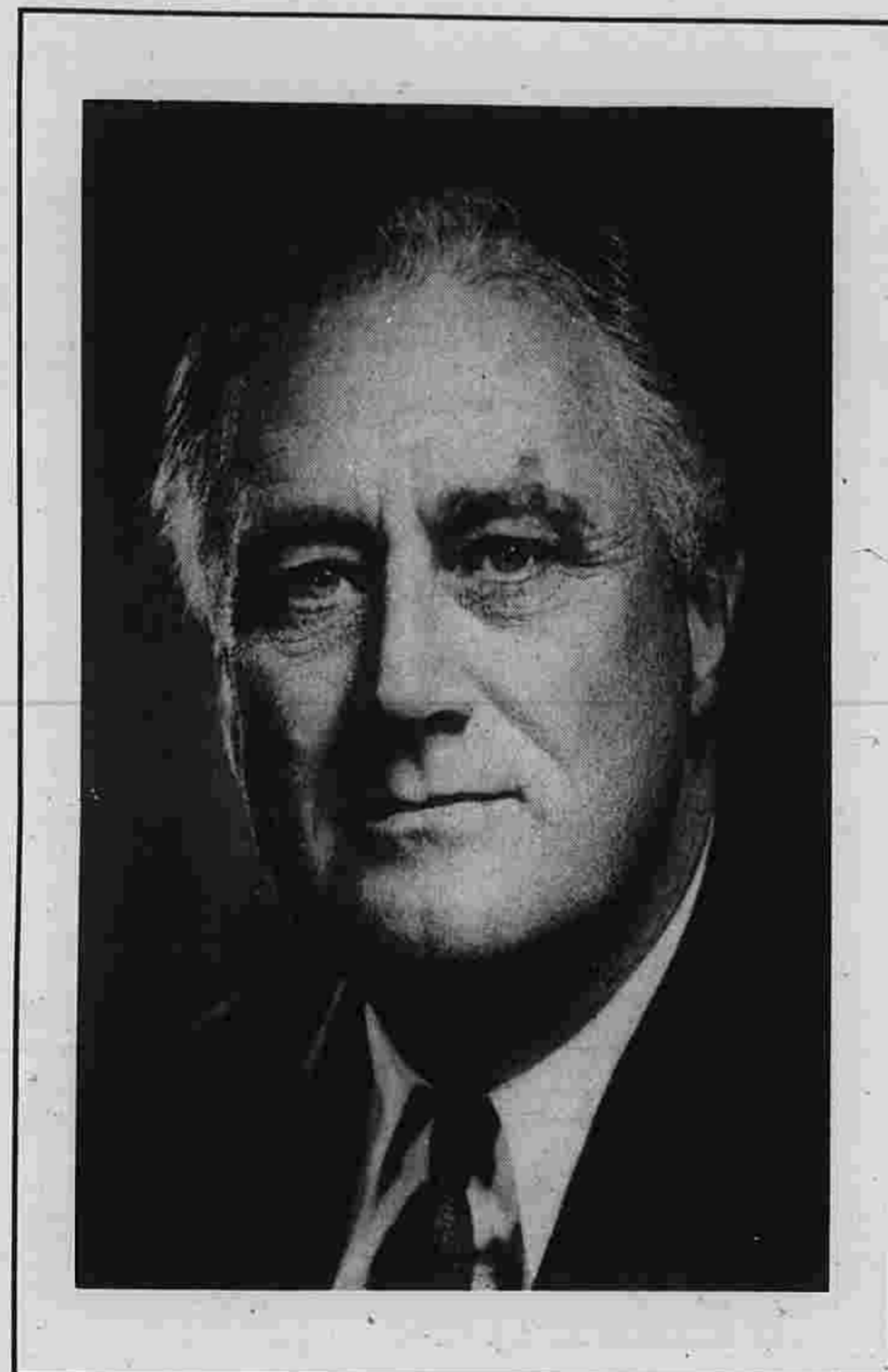

## Many Nations Extending Sea Territory

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — To British fishermen, Iceland's 50-mile limit is outrageous. But it may be a taste of things to come as one coastal country after another stakes claims to what were once regarded as the high seas.

At least six Latin American countries, including Brazil and Argentina, have proclaimed 200-mile territorial waters. Guinea, on the west coast of Africa, claims a 130-mile wide coastal strip, Gabon 100 miles. Many other countries have posted exclusive fishing or economic zones far offshore. They include Chile, Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Peru, with 200 miles; India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka with 112 miles; Ghana, 100 miles, and Morocco, 70 miles.

Canadian Environment Minister Jack Davis has said his country plans to claim exclusive fishing rights over its entire continental shelf, in some places wider than 200 miles. This would take in the Grand Banks of Newfoundland, traditional fishing grounds for the United States and many other countries.

Three miles, the traditional territorial limit, is recognized today by a dwindling number of countries, including the United States. Iceland and many others maintain that there is nothing in international law to stop a country from claiming more.

Iceland refuses to accept jurisdiction of the World Court in its fishing dispute with Britain. It says the court has no law under which to rule. This may change as a result of world conferences on the sea planned for Geneva in July, New York in November, and Santiago, Chile, next April.

Some 90 participating nations hope to write new maritime conventions reconciling the interests of major powers, coastal nations, the affluent, the needy and the landlocked. Preparatory meetings in early spring at U.N. headquarters indicated that general agreement may be reached on a new 12-mile maximum territorial limit — providing there is enough flexibility to grant exclusive fishing and mining preserves much farther offshore to countries demanding them.

The territorial issue would be resolved by creating a "patrimonial sea" between a country's territorial waters and international waters. In its patrimonial sea, a coastal country would have exclusive economic rights but perhaps share legal jurisdiction with other countries and with international agencies regulating such matters as seabed mining.

Width of the patrimonial sea would depend on factors such as water depth, geography, interests of nearby countries and the coastal country's technical development and needs.

The United States has announced support of the future 12-mile maximum territorial limit, provided absolute freedom of navigation is guaranteed through straits now in international waters.

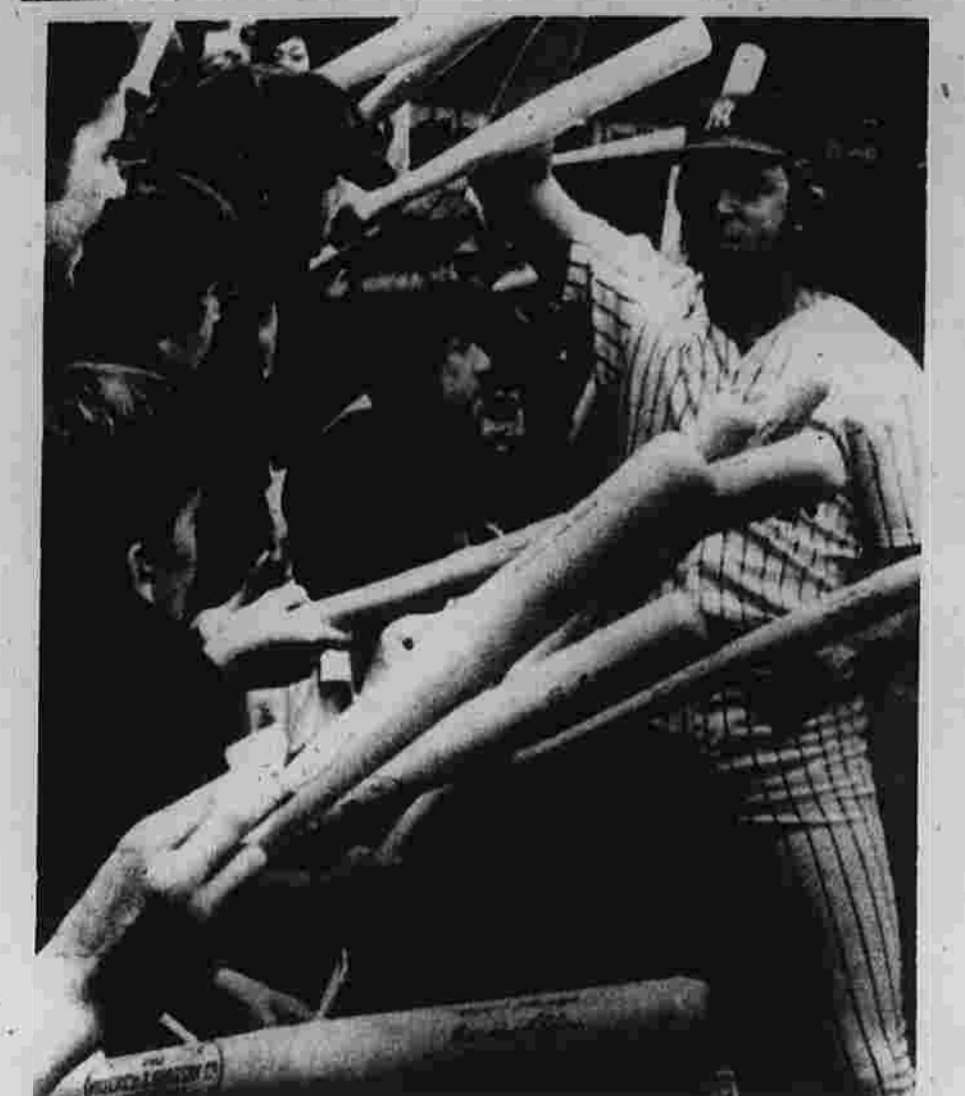
