1. Be alert and ready for shots. Keep your ey on the ball. Keep your knees bent and lean for ward a little, so your weight is on the balls a
2. As soon as you see in what direction the bal is coming, swing the racket back, keeping the
face perpendicular to the ground. 3. Step into the direction you wish to hit the 4. For the forehand, contact the ball beside th he ground. 5. For the backhand, contact the ball in fron of the forward foot with the racket perpendic 6. Carry the ball on the racket face as possible toward the target. 7. Follow through high with an upward and
outward movement still keeping the racket fac pervendicular to the still keep
The Grip
There are three types of grips commonly used They are the western, eastern and continental The most common are the eastern forehand and Forth with the handle held in a perpendicular posiion. For the backhand, you turn your thum ligh under the racket for about one eighth fa turn to the righ

The ready position keep your eye on the ball, knees bent and lean forward on the balls of your feet.

If both sides have three points, the score is "deuce" and a player must win two points in a row to win the game.

A set is when either side has won at least six games and is ahead by two games. There is a new choice in scoring sets. You can play out a set in the regular way, or, if you are at the score of 6 games for each side, the players can play a best-of-nine points to break the tie. The winner of the tie-break wins the set 7-6.

A match is usually made up of winning two out of three sets. If one side wins two sets in a row, the last set is not played. In tournaments, men play matches of three out of five sets. Women play tournament matches of two out of three sets.
