



Vatican Reaffirms Concept

VATICAN CITY (AP) - The Vatican Thursday reaffirmed the concept of the infallibility of the Roman Catholic Church, its teachings and the Pope in the face of attacks by some

All dogmas "must be believed with the same divine faith," said a 19-page document issued by the Sacred Congrega-tion for the Doctrine of the Faith, the Vatican office for combating doctrinal errors. The document was ratified by Pope Paul VI and distributed to It did not identify any of its

targets, but Vatican sources said it clearly was in reply to the controversial Swiss theologian Hans Kung. Father Kung has been under fire from the Vatican for his book "Infallible? An Inquiry. It contests the dogma of papal infallibility pronounced in 1870 by Vatican Council I under Pope Pius IX. The Vatican document made the following points:

—The objects of Catholic

faith, which are called dogmas,

"necessarily are and always have been the unalterable norm both for faith and for theological science."

-There is only one Church governed by the Pope as the successor of St. Peter in union with the Church's bishops.

—The Church is infallible and the notion of its infallibility is not to be corrupted.

—As established by the first
Vatican Council, the Pope is infallible when he speaks "ex cathedra"-that is, when he defines a doctrine concerning faith or morals to be held by the
