#### GAO Pegs High **Prices To** Wheat Exports

WASHINGTON (AP) - Last year's massive sale of U.S. wheat to the Soviet Union nearly doubled the domestic price of the grain and caused U.S. food prices to rise, according to a report to Congress.

The General Accounting Office (GAO) said Monday the wheat sale increased prices for bread and other flourbased products, and beef, pork, poultry, eggs and dairy products, because it caused higher feed grain costs.

The domestic wheat price umped from about \$1.68 a oushel in July 1972 to \$3 in May 1973 because of the \$700-million Russian sale, the GAO said. The sale also severely disrupted transportation facilities creating higher costs, shor-

The report also chided the administration for paying \$300 million in export subsidies, although "GAO believes many of these sales would have been made even with reduced sub-

#### Canada Cool Toward Yankees

A border is a border is a border, so it once seemed, with the notable exception of the United States-Canadian version.

For 4,000 unfortified miles (actually 5,500, counting Alaska in), it has long been among nations a monument to peaceful continental coexistence and. for individuals, largely a formality.

Unhindered access to each other's domains, involving little more than a courtesy slowing at customs posts, has been taken for granted by citizens of both the United States and Canada. Mostly the more numerous former. Visitors from the south pour millions

of tourist dollars into the Canadian economy annually. Many have stayed on to invest in Canadian business, buy Canadian property and, in increasing numbers in recent years, settle in Canada.

But times do indeed change. From the Canadian side, the border is becoming much more a legal reality. Tourists from the south are still acceptable - dollar devaluation and balance of payments problems so far notwithstanding.

But Americans intending to make new homes in Canada have been finding to their surprise that it is no longer almost as easy to move to Toronto or Vancouver as to Atlanta or San Diego. Entry requirements have been stiffened. Many unprepared would-be immigrants have been stopped or have experienced lengthy

delays at the border. On another front, several Canadian provinces have been moving to restrict land sales to U.S. citizens.

The issue in Canadian eyes is more than self-interest, it is selfpreservation. A problem with U.S. immigrants is that they run heavily to white-collar professionals whose skills are not in short supply in an economy where the unemployment rate is generally higher than in the United States. On the contrary, newcomers tend to settle in the larger cities and compete with native

Canadians for not-so-numerous jobs. And land, as Canada's prime asset, should be reserved first for Canadians. Americans, however, in increasing numbers have been buying choice sites for recreation and investment. Prices in preferred areas such as Ontario's hill and lake country have been forced up too rapidly, often beyond the reach of Canadians

There is nothing new in Canada's apprehension of the over-whelming economic power of its neighbor to the south. Needing the capital but fearful of forfeiting control of its own economy, Canada has long carefully monitored and specially taxed U.S. investment in Canadian enterprises.

But 'to many alarmed Canadians. actual physical possession of the land, particularly for speculative purposes, is something else again.

It has not yet come to "American Go Home!" And in any case that would be nothing new to Americans after all the experiences of the postwar decades of superpower.


