At issue is whether or not the President can or should withhold from the Senate Watergate Committee certain tapes and documents the committee feels necessary to its probe of the

As a layman, we cannot pretend to assess this so-called "constitutional crisis" from a legal point of view. However, in the light of Watergate revelations to date, the ability of some members of the legal profession to correctly interpret law can be dis-

The question, as we see it, is one of motive and intent.

There can be no question that presidential documents and tapes should be protected from fishing expeditions, whatever the source There is no question that a legislative body, acting in a legal and authorized capacity, has the right to examine whatever documents and tapes it can prove germane to its legally

authorized area of inquiry. The issue then, as we see it in a laymen's sense, is whether committee examination of presidential documents and tapes of conversations pertaining to Watergate testimony already offered is necessary.

Committee members have made it nuite clear by the issuing of their supoenas that the committee feels it essential to have these documents. The strongest reason thus far advanced is that the tapes and papers could presumably assist the committee in deciding conflicting testimony of several witnesses. In other words, if someone has been lying, who is the guilty person or per-

As laudable as this may be, the role of the committee as originally chartered by the Congress was to conduct an inquiry toward the end of roducing legislation to prevent any recurrence of any crimes the inquiry may have uncovered.

That the break-in of Watergate was a crime has been established. That there was a cover-up attempt partially accomplished has been established. That vast sums of campaign funds were solicited and disposed illegally has been established. That White House personnel were involved in various aspects of these crimes has been established.

The haggling of recent weeks has not been to uncover any new crimes (taping of the White House apparently is a sin shared by other tenants in varying degrees); but to find out how much, if anything, President Nixon

knew about the cover-up attempt. Thus the significance of the tapes and papers is not, as we see it, to find out if Dean or Mitchell, or both lied, but to nail the scandal to the up or not does not alter the truth. President's door.

The President thus had a Hobson's choice. The point, we Americans must now emember, is that the question of the President's guilt or innocence, involvement or non-involvement in the cover-up, is no longer germane to the scope of the committee's inquiry. It now has sufficient information to procede and legislate to hopefully prevent a future Watergate. It can do this, we believe, without White House tapes or documents.

Whether or not, the Watergate cover-up was known to the Presiden or not, does not contribute one iota to legislative action to resolve the issue The fact remains, under present laws, men so disposed to commit crimes could do so with or without presidential blessing. The President several veeks ago admitted that while these acts were not authorized by him. nevertheless, he must assume respon-

5. An exhaustive study of the issue of executive privilege and legislative privilege to reduce, to absolute minimum, secrecy in both branches of government. (After all the difference of an executive session of the Watergate committee and a private presidential meeting in the White House Oval Room is only one of degree since the public is only apprised of what either wishes the

public to know.) Let us remember, the White House horrors are not an original sin. (There are few of us who remember millions of Americans voting for a dying man because certain men around him believed America's resolve to wage and win World War II would vanish if it knew Franklin Delano Roosevelt
