# Assassination **Threat Cancels** Nixon Motorcade

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP)- President Nixon's motorcade through New Orleans was canceled today on advice of the Secret Service, which said it had uncovered a "possible conspiracy to assassinate the President" during his visit to

The Secret Service asked New Orleans police to arrest a former policeman who was described as armed and extremely dangerous.

Police declined to say whether the former policeman, identified as Edward N. Gaudet, alias "Puncy," was wanted in connection with the President's visit.

A White House spokesman said the change in motorcade plans resulted from an investigation by the Secret Service, the FBI and the New Orleans Police Department.

In Washington, Secret Service spokesman Jack Warner said: "Over the past week we have received information over a possible conspiracy to assassinate the President during his visit to New Orleans this date."

Warner said it was believed more than one person was involved.

The premier said he had telephoned the Pathet Lao delegation in Vientiane at midmorning to tell them they were safe and not to worry. It is the negotiations with the Pathet Lao, in which the Communistbacked insurgents are expected to win wide powers, that prompted Thao Ma's rightist coup attempt.

# **Man Convicted** Of Slaying 10

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. (AP) - Herbert W. Mullin, convicted of murdering 10 persons in a three-week shooting spree early this year, is to be sentenced Sept. 18. Mullin, wearing an orange

prison uniform and with his ankles chained, sat tight-lipped, staring straight ahead as the verdict was read Sunday in San-

ta Cruz County Superior Court.
The defense had admitted that Mullin, a 26-year-old former college honor student, committed the slayings. But it sought verdicts of innocent by

A six-man, six-woman jury in its third day of deliberations found Mullin guilty on two counts of first-degree murder and eight counts of seconddegree murder. He was judged sane on all 10 counts. Because the defense case was

based solely on Mullin's mental state, the guilt and sanity phases of the trial were held simultaneously. Mullin, son of a retired

Marine Corps sergeant from nearby Felton, was convicted of killing a young couple, a woman and her two young sons, four teen-age campers and an elder-ly ex-prizefighter.

Mullin took the witness stand

late in the three-week trial and admitted killing three more persons—a transient, a coed hitchhiker and a Los Gatos, Calif., priest stabbed to death in

# Bank Ups Prime

NEW YORK (AP) - First National Bank of Chicago announced today that effective Tuesday it was raising its prime rate to 91/2 per cent, the nighest in history.

The move was not unexpected since lending money remains in short supply. Other banks were expected to follow suit soon, credit analysts said. Some analysts have predicted

the rate may hit 10 per cent or higher before beginning to level The prime rate is the

minimum lending rate banks charge their largest and most credit-worthy corporate customers. While it is not directly tied to rates on small business and consumer loans, an increase in the prime rate frequently is an indication of higher interest rates generally and a tightening money supply. # Redding School To Use Senior Citizen Aides

REDDING (AP)- School officials hope senior citizens can teach youngsters with learning problems the basics of reading and arithmetic in an experimental program using retired persons as tutors.

The school district is recruiting retired persons to elp adolescents make instructional materials that can be used to teach other children in regular classes. Together the senior citizen

and the adolescent can make the materials and that way the adolescent can learn the skill that he should have learned long ago in school," said Mrs. Rosa Lee Saul, director of the pilot program for Regional District High School No. 9 and schools in Redding, Easton.

"By using retired people with skills we will be trying to involve children, involve senior citizens and create teaching aids for other classes," said Lawrence R. Miller, superintendent of the district which has been awarded a \$25,-000 federal grant to fund the Senior Citizen Tutoring

"It's almost like learning to read through an interest in About 600 of the approximate-

ly 3,000 students in the district have some perceptual or learning disability, Miller said, which is about the national average. There are about 96 children in the district aged 13-16 who are potential participants in the pilot program, Mrs. Saul said in an interview.

"The real guts of this program is finding senior citizens interested in volunteering," Miller said in an interview. "We want anybody we can find-plumbers, artists, housewives. The thinking is to get a breadth of background but the most important thing is an interest in children."

Mrs. Saul said the program would create a non-punitive relationship between the old and young participants. The adolescent who has been considered as a slow learner wouldn't be judged on his performance and wouldn't have to compete with other youths. "If I can find a carpenter to build a sandbox, think of all the math we can teach-the shape and size of the box, how much sand it will hold, the weight. You can learn all sorts of arithmetic building a sandbox, Miller said if the pilot effort

is a success, the district will seek funding for an expanded program for the following year. He said 20-25 per cent of the district's pupils now receive some form of special instructional attention. And up to 3 per cent of the children have such severe learning handicaps that they must be educated out of the district at a cost of up to \$15,000 a year for each child.







# New Approaches To Auto Pollution

According to glowing reports, engineers with the Honda Motor Company of Japan have solved one of two

major problems bugging U.S. They've done it by developing a "stratified charge" engine. something that has eluded American know-how, which they claim meets the original 1975 emission standards

(now postponed to 1976) for carbon

monoxide and hydrocarbons.

The stratified charge engine, utilizing dual combustion chambers in each cylinder, would eliminate the need for fuel-consuming add-on devices like the catalytic converters American technology has been pursuing. U.S. automakers are said to be working out licensing agreements with Honda. There remains the problem of

nitrogen oxides, however. To eliminate or reduce these requires recirculating exhaust fumes for further combustion, again at a penalty in driveability and fuel economy. Just recently, the Environmental

Protection Agency, at the behest of the auto industry, also postponed this scheduled standard for another year,
