Q. My wife and I both get monthly Social Security retirement payments and have Medicare coverage. We're planning a 20-day trip to Europe later this year. If either of us needs medical treatment while we're on our trip, will Medicare

A. No. Medicare cannot help pay for any health services you need while you're in Europe. Q. I heard that Medicare now covers kidney treatment and kidney transplants. Do I have to be getting monthly Social Security disability checks in order to qualify for this Medicare coverage? A. No. If you've worked long

enough under Social Security to be insured, you, your wife, and any dependent children who require dialysis or a kidney transplant are eligible for Medicare coverage. Eligibility begins the third month after the month in which dialysis begins. Security disability payments for almost five years. Because I need constant medication, my drug bills amount to nearly \$50 every month. Will Medicare help pay the bills?

A. Drugs are only covered by Medicare in special situations The hospital insurance program will pay for drugs you receive while a patient in a hospital or skilled nursing facility. 

My husband says one of the best things about this column are the "fringe benefits" I receive. There are all the new friends I make and the marvelous foods that are sent to me for tasting. Recently, we received additional fringe benefits in the gift of two containers of delicious home-made relishes. Both are easy to make, keep indefinitely. Except for mustard seed, all the ingredients are available year round. One recipe is for cucumber relish which I like because it has a nice vinegary flavor. It includes onion and green pepper. The other is carrot-cucumber

relish which is a little sweeter. Josephine Newton (Mrs. Robert) of 168 Benton St. found the carrot-cuke recipe in a 1971 issue of Better Homes and Gardens. It was recommended for church bazaars or fairs. She thinks it must truly be a home recipe as she has never found anything like it in any of her cookbooks. She did find the cucumber relish in a book of herbs and spices put out by a ommercial spice house. The one ingredient in both recipes that you may have to
