



Before a Congressional committee there is an interesting proposal to drop medical expenses as a tax deducion for federal income taxpayers.

As we understand it, the scheme would use the estimated \$7 billion accruing to the federal coffers to sweeten the kitty for a compulsory federal health insurance plan.

The concept, at this stage, has some merit if: 1, no fiscally feasible alternative to compulsory national health insurance can be formulated and 2, what controls could be imposed to keep medical costs from continuing to skyrocket should such a plan be im-

It is the latter area which concerns us the most. We have not had the time, nor the manpower, to research it thoroughly but it appears there has been more than a coincidental parallel in the rise of medical care cost and the institution of government-paid or government subsidized health programs such as

Medicare and Medicaid It is of concern to us that the quality of medical and health care in America and means to insure this to make careers in health fields financially atreasonable limitations somewhere

For many decades the medical profession, on an "ability to pay" basis, charged fees which insured them an adequate income befitting their profession and covered the expenses of care for those who were unable to pay or pay in full for services rendered. This was in the highest tradition of the Hippocratic

Oath. With the tapayer assuming the medical cost burdens of the poor, one would think costs could presumably decrease or at least level off a bit since the so-called "bad risks" are all

but eliminated. Now we concede that fees charged by doctors and specialists are not the sole cause of rising medical costs. Obviously the health industry has been it by inflationary costs of materials,

supplies, fuel, construction costs, etc. The thing that nags us a bit about a mandatory and presumably universal system of providing for health care costs through any program is the fact, as evidenced by so many federal aid programs, that it is easier to raise more money to pay rising costs than take the more difficult avenue of finding the means and ways to hold costs

With insurance picking up the tab, there is no doubt the health care needs of many now unable to afford them or who are being forced into bankruptcy by catastrophic illnesses could be helped, and should be helped.

But there is also the danger of over tolerable compared to the pain its treatment might have on the pocket-

The challenge before the Congress and the American people is achieving a balanced medical and health care program to insure early and prompt care for those who are in need of care health care quality by making it a

We believe in preventive medicine and if it is the desire of Congress to mprove the health of this nation perhaps it might consider using the estimated \$7 billion to be saved by eliminating the medical cost deductions to pay for mandatory annual physical examinations of all our

The cost of a cancer discovered at an early curable stage could be thousands of dollars less than terminal care for a person who found out too late. And this can be said of many of our major diseases which can be cured if diagnosed early enough.

Maybe the answer to much of the health problem in America today is not in who or how we pay the costs of hospitalization, medications and specialized care; but how to get each of us who feel fit as a fiddle to visit a doctor once year and stay that way.
