You Can't Stop The Tides

Recently the National Park Service announced that it is abandoning efforts to retain the sea's effect at various barrier islands on both coasts. And at the same time President Nixon has announced that the Cost of Living Council has been ordered to allow an increase in gasoline retail prices as a relief from Phase 4 price controls.

Centuries ago King Canute found that it was impossible to command the sea, and we hope that the administration is finding, at last, that it is impossible to restrain the free flow of economy. We think there is quite a parallel here.

At the Outer Banks of North Carolina and at Point Reyes, Calif., and other sites along the coasts, the Park Service has spent millions to stop the action of the oceans and the shifting of the sand dunes. It now concedes that the money is wasted and nature should be allowed to take its

Economically we have gone through all the phases. We saw beef grow scarce and out of sight when growers were restrained from raising their prices to the retailer. In the gasoline flasco we have seen rebellion, when service station operators have been constrained to hold the price line while wholesalers or refineries were allowed to raise their prices.

When will the administration learn that the laws of the market place cannot be superseded by government decree? You can not expect a cattle raiser to sell below his cost, nor can you expect a gas station owner to sell at a losing price.

The administration is trying to build

controlling the headwaters which have swollen the supply of money. In the past three fiscal years the

government has spent \$60 billion more than it had. Most of this has been paid for by money and credit created by the Federal Reserve Bank. From the 1967 through 1972 the

money supply at 6.7 per cent annually previous decade.

The Congress still continues to spend foolishly. We have seen the passage of another sacrosanct farm bill which means that the taxpayer will pay out billions in farm subsidy programs and continue to maintain and pay for soil banks. At the same time, in spite of all the

earlier floods and pessimism, the farmers are getting the best prices in Drought in Africa has brought six or

seven nations there to the brink of starvation. Yet, we continue to subsidize and restrain food production.

In spite of subsidies and restraints, however, farm productivity has risen 500 per cent in the country since 1945 and is up 27 per cent in the past five years. Opportunities for foreign sales of American food is greater than ever. Yet we continue the farm bills which sprung up in the depression years of

We hope the administration is learning its lesson and will stop piddling efforts to fight inflations effects and start combatting the cause, which is federal overspending. Then perhaps we can start to hold back the seas of

Dual Economy Problems

You can't have it both ways is a common phrase used to point out contradictions or situations in which you are faced with hard but definite

In the wake of the withdrawal from Southeast Asia, Congress has been zeroing in on defense budget requests. While final action hasn't been taken whatever the outcome, Connecticut is affected for good or evil or a bit of

A plan to slow the Trident Submarine program was stopped in the Senate but a Congressionallymandated overall troop reduction abroad has been approved.

The problem facing Connecticut and the nation as a whole is that since World War 2, we have been maintaining a dual economy in a certain

Our "war" or defense efforts, overseas military aid, etc., have been conducted without curtailment of our consumer economy.

Unlike World War 2, when the production of automobiles, major appliances, etc., except those needed by the military were suspended, we have since had a full-blown consumer economy, plus the addition of meeting military hardware needs of much of the world, plus active involvement of our own forces in Korea and South

This means we are faced with

economic dislocations by any substantial cutback in military procurement or other defense needs unless by some miracle the manpower now engaged in such work can be diverted to nonmilitary production.

With present consumer production at near capacity, it is hard to see anything ahead but some painful dislocations until new jobs are found. Rhode Island and Massachusetts in particular face this dilemma in the wake of closing military bases.

As we have stated before, Congress should consider developing some type of program to provide for a more orderly shift from so-called "war" to peace production.

We believe a budget should be balanced but one of the keystones to such a goal is balanced economy and one that is strong enough to adapt to the changing consumer as well as national security needs.

It is not enough to have a plan to gear-up quickly for war, we also need a plan to gear down for peace.

Clearly we have a hard choice to make for we cannot have it both ways, a balanced budget and a blank check for national defense. We believe we must balance the budget but however desirable this goal may be, how that balancing is done to minimize the impact it is going to have on our own state's economy and the economies of other states, is just as important.
