The President's Choice

House Minority Leader Gerald Ford of Michigan has been nominated to succeed Spiro Agnew as vice presi-

Initial reaction to President Richard Nixon's selection of the 25year House veteran and Republican administration loyalist indicates quick confirmation by colleagues in the House and a slower but affirmative assent in the Senate.

The President, in selecting Ford, has opened the door to a new relationship with the Congress but only time will tell whether Ford as vice president and president of the Senate will be able to bring the administration and Congress closer together on the many issues which need action.

Both the President and Ford have pledged an effort to cooperate. The sudden departure of Agnew, the yet to be fully resolved ramifications of Watergate, and the serious threat to world peace posed in the Middle East will not make the task an easy one.

Ford, with his legislative background, can serve the President and the nation well as a liaison between the two branches - if he is given the full opportunity.

The President has indicated but not spelled out this desire. It would be our hope that Ford will be given some responsibility in the domestic area to balance the President's obvious preference for dealing with international problems.

Ford brings good credentials to this task by, in effect, being promoted up

through the ranks. He can be, as he expressed his desire to be, a uniting force in the

Whether he achieves this, however will not depend upon Ford as much as it will upon the President's willingness to back up his olive branch of words with action and the reaction of Ford's former colleagues in the House and in the Senate.

While initial reaction to the choice has been excellent the tragedy of American politics is that vice presidents have no inherent powers of their own except that of personality and persuasion. Accepting Ford as the new vice president will not necessarily mean the Congress will accept as readily Nixon proposals now before it or about to be presented to it.

It means, for the moment, the President has wisely avoided an unnessary clash with the Democratically-controlled Congress by picking a man who has their respect and admiration. The struggle for the 1976 nomination remains wide open and whether Ford gains an edge hinges not on the title of vice presitunities to be more than a stand-by

The President is to be commended for taking his conciliatory approach and in picking a capable man of integrity as evidenced by the bipartisan endorsements Ford was given.

The Question Remains

While we agree the Agnew deal may have been in the best national interest at this time, the fundamental constitutional issue raised by the beleaguered ex-vice president

Does a vice president have immunity from criminal indictment until he is successfully impeached?

The negotiated settlement of charges against Agnew in which he pleaded no contest to a tax evasion felony and was fined, ended for now a legal battle to define this gray area of our Constitution.

Granted, that such a legal dispute would take months or years to reach the Supreme Court and could have been very divisive for the country.

Perhaps, after the furor has died down, the Congress and the Administration might consider clarification of the Constitution to avoid such a crisis should it arise in the future.

We believe in due process of law and that every man should be able to have tes day in court. We believe the Constitution is basically sound in seaving final interpretation of the Constitution and laws enacted under it to the Supreme Court.

But the problem, as brought out in the Agnew affair, is that this due process and ultimate judicial determination, when it involves people high

The real tragedy of the Agnew affair, we think, is not so much that a man betrayed a public trust but the gap in some of our constitutional interpretations which made a deal and limited prosecution a political

We would suggest the Congress enact a law spelling out the rights and duties of a vice president specifically denying him immunity from criminal prosecution. We would suggest the new vice president challenge it as "a friend of the court," before the U.S. Supreme Court, so that this issue can rather than on an actual legal challenge of the question as would have been the case if Agnew had not

This time the principal involved was willing to make a deal. At some future time, this might not be the case. We feel the Congress can and should avert this possibility by facing up to the constitutional issue which Agnew raised but did not pursue. Not to do so would not be in the national
