



The slow down by state troopers to dramatize their demands for salary increases is but the latest in a series of work actions by policemen,

teachers, and other state employes. Limited in collective bargaining because of no-strike laws, the employes have taken to other devices to make their points, such as slow downs and calling in "sick."

It is increasing and the General Assembly and the Meskill Administration will probably be faced with some type of law which will give state workers similar collective bargaining rights as those enjoyed by non-public employes.

This obviously will be highly controversial for partisan as well as social and economic reasons. But the challenge is there and will

have to be faced. The idea of school shutdowns because of teachers reporting "ill" or traffic law enforcement being ignored as part of a protest, is a confrontationtype of bargaining in areas where we, as citizens, have come to expect negotiation and conciliation to prevail. Each of us has horror of the thought of a fire department or a

hospital medical staff walking off the job. This is why, in the case of emergency services particularly, the


no-strike clause has broad support. Thus, giving public employes the right to strike may not be practical at

The alternative is to be openminded and seek out some uniform means of arbitrating employe-state salary differences; making the right to strike not necessary, and governing the other tactics of slow downs and calling in sick.

It is a challenge to the leadership of state administrators, legislators, and those representing public employes.

We must weigh on the one hand the overall public welfare and security and the basic right of every worker, public or private, to negotiate individually or collectively with his employer. That public employes, especially in certain sectors of public service cannot take the same actions such as striking as private employes, does not mean they should be

Some compromise is in order lest the slow downs and "sick calls" spread to a point where there is a polarization detrimental to both sides.

Fuels The Crisis

Refining Pinch

All aside from the question whether we get gasoline rationing soon to deal with immediate shortages, the matter of meeting tomorrow's constantly rising fuel needs is not being dealt with urgently and in orderly fashion.

For instance, it is well known that oil refinery capacity in the next few years at the same

this country has not grown in the past few years at the same pace as the demand for refined products. So our sharply ris-ing fuel imports have been including both these and crude

This year, with our daily consumption of crude reaching 17 million barrels a day (compared to 14.2 million for all Western Europe), U.S. refinery capacity is estimated by the industry at 13,234,000 barrels a day. That represents an advance over 1970 of less than a million barrels a day, even as the U.S. automobile population and other oil users have risen sharply.

sharply.

The outlook for the years just ahead seems a good deal worse, unless we quickly find additional fuel sources.

By 1975, assuming no miracle breakthroughs for other kinds of energy like solar, nuclear or geo-thermal, U.S. oil demands will be at 19.8 million barrels a day. The figure will touch an estimated 22.5 million in 1980 and a whopping 28.2 million in 1985.

In the meantime, under present projections, refinery capacity in the U.S. will be climbing only very slowly, to 13.7 million barrels a day in 1975, 15.6 million in 1980, and 17.3 in

1985. The foreseeable 1985 gap is huge.

The situation really is perilous. To the extent President Nixon has not been pre-occupied with Watergate, he and his

Such debates may be inescapable in a free society wherein

many leaders detest the idea of stiff controls and some deeply question their feasibility in time of peace. But, ob-viously, this short-range struggle distracts the counsellors

The Marshall Plan and the Truman Policy pumped billions upon billions of dollars into discouraged countries. Now newspapers in those countries are writing about the decadent, warmongering Americans.

I'd like to see just one of those countries that is gloating over the erosion of the United States dollar build its own airplanes. Come on, let's here it!
