Very much in the thoughts of weather forecasters and oil distributors these days

are the words "degree days." What are they? Basically, they are a measure of heating requirements. They help tell your oil com pany what your oil requirements are and reminds it to deliver oil to your home before your tank is empty.

And if the proposed 68 degree ther-

mometer setting leaves you cold, just remember that 65 degrees is the basis for figuring degree days. It has been deter-mined that it is below 65 degrees when most people feel uncomfortable — unless the heat is turned on for at least part of the

Now for computing "degree days." Take the sum of the day's highest and lowest temperature, cut it in half, and subtract the result from 65 degrees. The resulting figure is the number of degree days for that day.

For example: If the high for the day is 55 and the low 40, the sum is 95. Half of 95 is 471/2. Subtracting 471/2 from 65 leaves

"Cold fronts" and "warm fronts" are

often mentioned by weather forecasters.

A "cold front" occurs when cold air pushes back cold air, we have the reverse, a "warm front." A "stationary front" occurs when neither the cold nor warm air wins over the other. Some things to watch for, if you want to be your own weather forecaster, follow:

The temperature will rise when the skies are cloudy at night, northwest winds become calm and the wind shifts to south or east, southerly winds increase with clouds moving from the west, and a "warm front" passes through. The temperature will fall when the clouds break up after a storm, the wind shifts to north or northwest, the night is clear and the winds light, and a "cold

front" has passed through.
Or, purchase a reasonably accurate thermometer, install it outside a window facing north, so that as little sunlight as sible will fall on it, and keep watching





Areport to our customers on fuel supplies for generating electricity

Your efforts to conserve energy are producing significant savings in fuels used to generate electricity. However, it is important that they be continued — and increased, if possible since the future residual oil supply situation for the companies of Northeast Utilities has deteriorated in the past week.

Northeast Utilities' Supply of Oil

As of Wednesday, December 5, the Northeast Utilities companies had 1.938,000 barrels of residual oil in storage or about a twenty-two-day supply. Our projections now indicate that on January 2, we will have 922,000 barrels in storage or a ten-day supply, and by January 30 some 174,000 barrels or less than a two-day supply.

On November 30, we were notified by our principal supplier that a 10 percent reduction of December deliveries had been placed in effect due to the worsening world oil shortage. On December 6, another supplier notified us of a 15 percent reduction in deliveries effective immediately. Remaining deliveries from our suppliers may also be subject to further curtailment if mandatory or voluntary residual oil allocation quotas are placed in effect nationally.

Northeast Utilities' Supply of Coal

Our 147,000-kilowatt generating unit at Mt. Tom Station at Holyoke, Mass., is ready to operate on coal with 60,000 tons available on site, about a two-months supply. Our West Springfield, Mass., Station also has about 60,000 tons of coal on site. However, conversion of two 51.500-kilowatt units at this station has not commenced, since permission to burn or receive additional coal at either Mt. Tom or West Springfield has not been received from the Massachusetts Public Health Council.

On November 30, the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection granted permission under certain conditions to convert to coal 85,000 kilowatts at our Montville Conn., Station, and 193,000 kilowatts at our Middletown, Conn., Station. Conversion of a 120,000-kilowatt generating unit at Middletown is under way. Middletown has 30,000 tons of coal on site with an additional 10,000 tons scheduled for delivery during the next four weeks, or about a 30-day supply. Montville has no coal on site, but about 12,000 tons scheduled for delivery during this period.

Conversion of the generating unit at Mt. Tom, two units at West Springfield, two units at Middletown and three units at Montville would permit some 25 percent of the total fossil-fueled capacity of our system to burn coal. However, it should be noted that a dependable supply of coal from the mines and coal cars to deliver a steady supply cannot be assured at this time, although every effort is being made to strengthen procurement, despite highly competitive conditions.

Thanks to warmer weather and the cooperative conservation efforts of our customers, the Northeast Utilities system experienced an 8.2 percent reduction in customer demand from projected estimates in November. Actual use was even some 3.2 percent below that of November 1972, despite the addition of some 20,000 new customers. However, temperatures for the month were considerably above last year's (782 versus 635 degree days or 18.8 percent).

The New England Situation

New England as a region also experienced a November decline from projected demand of 7.5 percent and an actual November of 1972. Again, mild temperatures in the six-state region must be recognized as a contributing factor.

The companies of Northeast Utilities operate as an integral part of the interconnected regional utility network which forms the New England Power Pool. Availability of fossil fuels throughout New England, therefore, is the dominant factor in the ability of our companies to provide uninterrupted electric service during the fuels emergency which is expected to become more severe in the weeks and months immediately

As you perhaps know, the Northeast Utilities system is issuing a weekly fuels report to government officials and to the




