The smoke pushes up from a small opening in the top and whips around Essie's face, across her unblinking brown eyes and sprints out a crack in a window or under a door.

Essie, the widow of long dead (1930) migrant cotton picker Jim Swiney, is 111 years old. he will be 112 on Christmas Day. In this Essie Swiney has "I don't want to live nowhere else," said the tiny lady, stooped against the winter wind and the years. "This is my



The gifts of sweaters and mittens seem more utilitarian than that something you really don't need but reflect the spirit of giving more because it isn't really useful.
