A Shutterbug Will Snap You If You Don't Watch Out!

The Parts of a Camera


A - The lens collects the light rays reflected from the subject and focuses them on the film to form the image.

B - The diaphram controls the size of the lens opening.
C - The shutter controls the amount of time the film is exposed to the light.

D - The film.
E-The camera box.
F-The film advance knobs.
 Midea to start with black and Whits good because it costs less and needs less light for good pictures than color film.
4. Think about your picture before you take it. Shoot the center of interest. Don't make your picture too busy; simple shots make the best pictures. Try to let the picture tell a story. Don't get too far away from your subject. Don't stand too close, either. Watch the background.
5. Keep objects and fingers away from the lens.
6. Be careful while loading and unloading your camera. Don't unload it until you have finished shooting the entire roll.
7. Take good care of your camera. Learn how to clean it and the lens. Don't keep it in the sunlight. Keep it away from damp places.
8. Be' sure you have enough light. Start by taking outdoor pictures. Then move inside and use a flash. Don't shoot with a flash if you have a shiny background or a mirror behind the subject

## The Opossum

The female opossum is like the kangaroo because she carries her babies in a pouch. The babies are very small when they are born. Over 20 could fit in a
teaspoon! They climb into their mother's pouch and stay there until they are eight to ten weeks old.

Opossums hunt at night, eating insects, mice, frogs, birds, berries and fruits. They are good climbers and sometimes sleep in trees. When frightened, they play dead. They fall over, their eyes close and their tongue hangs out. The saying "playing 'possum" comes from this behavior.
