Let's Shorten Campaigns

Why is it whenever campaign reform is discussed the idea of a shorter campaign period is treated so

It seems strange, and always has to us, that other nations, namely Great Britain and Canada, are able to conduct national elections in a few weeks whereas ours occupy the biggest part of an election year.

But the more we think about the idea of a six-week state or national campaign, the more we are inclined to believe such a move is basic to any significant election reform in our state and nation.

First, a shorter campaign would obviously be easier to control from the standpoint of expenditures because the campaigns would have to be better planned and executed to be effective. Second, a shorter campaign period

of necessity would force political parties to get out of the 19th Century and into the Twentieth as far as streamlining the selection of candidates and crystalizing their party platforms so that the campaigns become a source of party and candidate positions on the issues rather than a series of trial ballons changing

with each new public opinion poll. Third, a shorter campaign would decisions more and decrease the alleged influence of the public opinion polls - too many of which are comor candidate positions.

And finally, but most important, the short campaign would recognize the voter as an intelligent participant in the democratic process. In the last century it may have been necessary to have long campaigns to enable the candidate to reach as many of the electorate as possible. But with today's modern communications media this is no longer necessary. If the candidates and the parties cannot get their message across to the voters in a few weeks of concentrated campaigning, there is serious question as to their qualifications for public office

We can talk all we want about limiting dollars spent, public disclosure of public officials' assets, reporting and publicizing campaign contributions, and other reforms which must be considered, but it is basic to any reform that the length of campaigns be shortened, not to the convenience of the political parties, but because the electorate does not need nor want extended campaigns where they are politically bombarded

If six weeks isn't long enough to debate the issues before us, then worse shape than we have been told in the many, many, long, long cam-



Agnew Protection Ruled Unjustified

WASHINGTON (UPI) resident Nixon has no legal authority to give former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew Secret Service protection. Comptroller General Elmer B. Staats says.



"They really don't want to strangle a franchise," he says. Where the problem arises is when one owner becomes, let's say overenthusiastic, and announces he's going to win the championship no matter how much it costs. He then sets a new market value for all the other people in sports."

Pro football players, according to Woolf, are the lowest paid performers among those in the four major sports. Basketball players get the most, he says, followed by hockey and basebal players, who by the way, are about to go to arbitration boards with their employers for the first time ever in two weeks. WASHINGTON (UPI) - Rep Howard W. Robison, R-N.Y. said Tuesday he is retiring after 17 years in Congress. He is the 15th Republican congressman who has announced he will not seek re-election this year. Citing as a factor in his retirement, the "disanpointments' of the Nixon ad ministration, the 59-year-old dean of the New York congressional delegation said he made his decision to quit within the last week. "It truly isn't much fun

anymore" he told newsmen in his office, "particularly under the circumstances." Robison, who serves on the House Appropriations Committee, said, however, he felt he could win re-election if he had decided to run for another

He said that, if the Republican Party and President Nixon were in better shape at present, he might have considered seeking another term. resolve it." Robison said, however, that "It is crystal clear to me that I will be far freer to work in that direction if I am not a candidate for re-election."

Reward To Policeman?

Arsonists set fire to a large warehouse one night, and the owners offered a \$10,000 reward for catching the culprits. A few days later, an alert policeman picked up the guilty pair in a bar. In this situation, was the policeman entitled to the \$10,000? He insisted that he was, but a court ruled against him. The court said he could not collect a reward for

paying him to do: capture criminals.

This is the rule in most circumstances, that a policeman (or other public employee) cannot demand a reward for merely doing his

doing what the city was already

Otherwise, explained one judge, "whenever a crime was committed, instead of speedy efforts for the arrest of the offender, there would be a holding back in the hope that a reward would be offered."

On the other hand, an officer usually can collect the reward if

usually can collect the reward if what he did was outside the scope of his duties. For example:

A deputy sheriff, on vacation in a neighboring county, had occasion to help in the capture of a bank robber. Learning that the bank had offered a reward, he decided to put in a claim for it.

This time, the court ruled in his favor. The court said that, having acted strictly on his own, he had as much right to the reward as any other deserving citizen.

One famous case involved a hotel fire so fierce that firemen gave up their efforts to get into the building. Suddenly an anguished

onlooker cried:
"I will give \$5,000 to anyone who will bring out my wife!"
One fireman, galvanized into action, fought his way through the flames and managed to bring the

woman out.

Later, when he tried to collect the reward, the husband argued that rescuing people was part of a fireman's job. But the court said a fireman's job did not include rescues involving such a dire risk to his own life. For action above and beyond the call of duty, said the court, this fireman had earned the reward.

Social Security

Q. I have been working for a contractor and paying into Social Security for the past 20 years. I am usually off at least three months a year. After I reach 62 next month, can I collect Social Security retirement benefits for these months I don't work?

A. Yes. You may be able to collect reduced retirement benefits at 62 for the months in which you do not earn over \$200 a month. You should contact a Social Security office and discuss the details of your particular case.

Q. I get monthly Social

Security retirement checks. Because I earn a little over \$2,-400 each year, I have to file an annual report of my earnings with Social Security. Since I will be 72 in July, will I have to file an annual report for 1974? A. Yes. It's true that there is no limit on how much people 72 years old and over can earn without any reduction in their Social Security. But since you will not be 72 during some months of 1973-January through June - you must file an annual report of your earnings for the entire year. No annual report will be required for 1975 and later years. Q. I get Social Security

payments as a widow. I do not work, but I own a small apartment building. Does my rental income count toward the \$2,400 a year that I can earn before Social Security payments are reduced?

A. No. Only wages and self-

A. No. Only wages and selfemployment income count as earnings for Social Security purposes. Rental income will not affect your cash benefits unless you are a real estate dealer.

Q. I am planning to retire

from my job in June, when I become 65. Since my earnings from the six months before I retire will add up to nearly \$5,-000, can I receive my monthly cash payments for the rest of the year?

A. Yes. No matter how much you earn before you retire, you

A. Yes. No matter how much you earn before you retire, you can still receive Social Security benefits for any month you neither earn wages of \$200 or less por perform substantial work as a self-employed person.

The truth is they may be liable for nothing at all.

an amendment to the Truth in Lending Law went into effect. It says a credit card holder is liable for up to \$50 in unauthorized use — but only if the company which issued the card, such as an oil company or bank, complies with very specific requirements in the law.

You are hable for up to \$50 only if the company has told

You are hable for up to \$50 only if the company has told you so in writing; provided you with a credit card that has a means of identifying you as the user—such as a blank for your signature; and has sent you a self-addressed, pre-stamped enveloped or postcard for you to send back to them to alert them to a theft or loss.

Report Loss Unless all of that has happened you owe nothing at all if someone steals your card and goes on a buying spree. If all of the conditions have been met by the company which issued you the card. you still might wind up owing nothing because your \$50 iability ends the moment you ake reasonable steps to let the firm know your card is nissing. Government lawyers say a telephone call to the company constitutes such a reasonable step. It probably would not hurt to follow it up with a letter.

It would also be to your advantage to find out, right now, what telephone numbers you should call and keep a list of them, along with your credit card numbers. Some consumers report they have had a hard time getting through to the company involved by telephone, so it may take several calls before you finally are able to make the proper notification.

Most oil companies have not been notifying their customers of their limited liability or providing them with return forms. So if you lose a gasoline credit card

But some of the big bank-related and independent credit card companies have complied and you would be liable for up to \$50 per card, until you notify them.

Both the Securities and Exchange Commission and the White House Office of Consumer Affairs are warning would-be investors that some people who have bought the booze are having a hardtime unloading it when the alleged time to collect comes. In addition the prices you may pay to begin with are sometimes inflated, making the selling price little more than the investment was to begin with A good investment counsellor and a detailed prospectus on the stock may be your best safeguard.






