## Black Mayors Elected to Office in 95 Cities!

Meet Coleman Young, the new Mayor of Detroit, Michigan. He is one of the 95 black mayors heading city governments across the country.

Before becoming mayor, Mr. Young, a Democrat, served in the Michigan State Senate where he was an outstanding leader. He was born in Alabama in 1918, but his family moved to Detroit four years later. Mayor Young runs a Barb-B-Que Restaurant. He is also in the housing business.

Black mayors have been elected to serve in some of our country's bigger cities including Cincinnati, Dayton and Cleveland in Ohio. Black mayors also serve in East Orange, New Jersey and Berkeley, California.


Clarence Lightner was sworn in as Mayor of Raleigh,

Mayor Maynard Jackson of Atlanta, Georgia, is a 35 -year-old attorney. He served as vicemayor before he was elected in 1973.


Kenneth A. Gibson was 38 -years-old when he was elected Mayor of Newark, New Jersey in 1970. He is a civil engineer.


Thomas Bradley of Los Angeles, California, is a $55-$
4 year-old expoliceman and former city councilman. He was elected mayor in 1973.

Richard Gordon Hatcher of Gary, Indiana, is a lawyer. He was acity councilman before becoming mayor in 1967. He was 34 years old when elected.


## Animal of the Week

## The Greater Kudu

Greater kudus live in the bush country in Africa. They move about at night and rest during the day. The females live in small herds, often without males. The bulls live alone, or with a group of other males.
Kudus eat plants. They

put lookouts on the highest hills in the area while they are feeding so they can be warned of danger. They are good jumpers and must have fences more than 7 feet high to keep them in an area. A male can weigh as much as 700 pounds and has large corkscrew like horns. The female has no horns.


Lincoln Statue
This statue was carved from a log in the 1930's by William Norris, who lived from 1861 to 1946 . He used a pocket knife for the details. In some places he added plaster to build up the form. Real buttons for the coat and shirt were nailed on and painted.
