Where the Wild Things Are is about a boy named Max who gets into trouble and is sent to bed without his supper. He sails away to become king of the monsterlike "wild things." Children often call this book, "The Monster Book." It's a favorite. It won the 1963 Caldecott Medal for the best illustrations by an American artist.

## Maurice Sendak

Maurice Sendak is one of the world's leading children's book illustrators. In 1970, he won the Hans Christian Andersen Medal, the highest worldwide honor given to an illustrator. He is also an author and has written some of the 60 books he has illustrated.



Mr. Sendak is a 45 -year-old bachelor who lives in a farmhouse in southern Connecticut. He works in a big studio that has a writing table, a work table, a couch, a drawing table and many bookcases. His windows overlook a pretty landscape.

## The Wild Things

Mr. Sendak thought about writing Where The Wild Things Are for three years. He sat down and wrote it in an hour, and took a year and a half to illustrate it.

## His Ideas

Children often ask him where he gets his ideas. He feels they are like dreams. They come from an unconscious source in his brain. It's really a mystery.

## Pets and Hobbies

Mr. Sendak had a terrier named Jennie who lived to be 14 years old. His own favorite book, Higgity Pigglety Pop, is about her. He now has two dogs, a German shepherd named Erda and a Golden retriever named Io.

Mr. Sendak likes to collect
and to read books. He has just taken up needlepoint, which he does while relaxing and watching $T$ V.

## Hard Work

After finishing high school in Brooklyn, New York, he went to work for a window display company in New York. He studied art at night school. Mr. Sendak believes that hard work is the secret to success. He is working on a TV special planned for next Christmas.

## His Goal

Mr. Sendak does not write just for children. His books are for people of all ages. His goal is to tell the truth and not soften the facts. He believes that children are a lot smarter than they are given credit for being. His success shows how much readers like what he does.
