



We are right back where we were 16 years ago when the Supreme Court, in the words of three of the dissenters in the 5-4 decision, first got itself into "the mire of case-by-case determinations of obscenity" and, in the words of Associate Justice Brennan, set itself up as the nation's censor.

The Growth of Crime

There is more crime in this country than ever before. It is, however, not a major concern of enough people, despite the fact that nobody in his or her right mind would walk down most

city streets in America after dark. Small town streets are still mostly safe. Since 1963, the population has increased 17 per cent, while violent crime has increased 174 per cent murder is up 129 per cent, forcible rape is up 92 per cent, robberies are up 226 per cent, aggravated assaults up 139 per cent.

Now if enough people were really concerned about crime, we would be doing something about it. Law and Order would not be an empty slogan but a key political issue. We would not be waiting until crime becomes much

worse or until it takes over. More policemen will not solve the problem. In city after city, police has climbed still faster. Chicago, Los Angeles, and many other major cities

In Washington, D.C., the police force was increased 55 per cent in three years. Crime dropped 38 per cent because, in Washington, the court system was reorganized at the same time. The time from arrest to trial, to sentencing, to freedom or jail, was dramatically cut.

It has long been recognized that our courts need stream lining. They are one of the key factors in our continued growth of crime. But also there are many other reasons, now being explored by criminologists, and worthy of every citizen's attention.

A turn around in this terrible and disgraceful record of crime increase must be made and every national, state and town resource should be brought to bear to see that we do reverse this dire trend.

With the score tied 7-7, Mike Lassiter blocked a punt by New York's Robbie Reynolds on the Stars' 34-yard line, scooped up the ball and ran it to the seven-yard line. Sharks' back Tommy Durrance took

a handoff from quarterback Kay Stephenson, and fumbled the ball into the end zone. O.Z. White pounced on the ball for the winning touchdown with 2:02 left in the game. After that, the Sharks held off a New York drive that ended on Jacksonville's 37-yard line to preserve

The Sharks opened the scoring with 5:47 left in the second half after a scoreless first quarter. Alvin Wyatt took a kickoff on his own 13 and scampered 87 yards up the sideline for the touchdown.

"Everybody thought the ball was going out of bounds," said New York Coach Bebe Parilli. New York put together what appeared a sure scoring drive early in the second quarter, but Jacksonville held the Stars on fourth down at the two yard line to take over the ball.

"Our inability to score on the two yard line killed us," said Parilli. "I'd still go for it again, though.' The game stayed tied at 7-7 during the third quarter with neither team able to mount a scoring drive. New York's only score came on an eight-yard pass from quarterback Tom Sherman to former New York Jets wide receiver George Sauer with 1:41 left in the half. The action point



The school board says teacher facilities are one of many competing needs of the school system that require taxpayer dollars. "It is the board's obligation under the law to balance the competing demands made for money and establish priorities." Post said. "The board believes that such restrictions on board responsibilities should not be included in an employment contract of the teachers."


