The would-be presidential assassin, a suspected member of an anti-government youth group, was wounded by security guards and taken into custody. Mrs. Park, 49, admired by many Korean women as a

model of true national beauty, was struck in the head by a bullet intended for her husband. The gunman ran screaming down the aisle in the crowded theater where Park was delivering a speech commemorating Korea's liberation from Japan in World War

Boston Under the Gun

Next week may produce a confrontation that could have ramifications in our state.

The federal Environmental Protection Agency has given 1,500 companies in Boston one week to come up with plans to cut their employe parking spaces by 25 per cent.

The order was originally issued last November to firms employing 50 or more persons to encourage car pooling and use of mass transit. The deadline for compliance was July 31. Of 3,100 employers covered by the order, 1,500 have failed to come up with desired plans.

According to Deputy EPA administrator John R. Quarles Jr. these firms must submit a plan by next Monday or be faced with notices of violation. Eventually they could be

It is the first effort by EPA to enforce its controversial transportation control plans which were drawn up for most of the nation's major urban areas late last year.

If the EPA is successful in making its ruling stand, there is no doubt that once the major urban areas have been brought into compliance, the agency will move on the lesser areas such as Greater Hartford.

We in Connecticut are particularly vulnerable to this approach toward cleaning the nation's air since we are between Boston and New York City. another area involved in the same order last November.

Depending on the outcome of the issue in Boston, mass transit and car pooling in Connecticut may no longer be a personal option but a mandatory mode of transportation for many of If the federal EPA orders the same

for the Greater Hartford area. Bridgeport and New Haven, will our employers and the state transportation department be ready?

Time is running out and the present system of commuter parking lots, while a step in the right direction, may not be adequate for the job.

Price Hikes Follow Wage Increases

Praise is due I.W. Abel, president of the United Steel Workers, for his courage in Milwaukee speech asserting that the economy "will go to hell" unless labor stops asking for huge raises and management stops raising prices.

Abel seems to accept the premise that wage increases are naturally followed by price increases. Hence the raise is vitiated and the worker makes no real gains.

His economic savvy contrasts with that of AFL-CIO President George Meany who in a Chicago speech said that labor has no recourse but to seek wage increases and cost-of-living escalator clauses for members.

Meany said it was impossible for members to save money, as urged by the administration, when they could

hardly meet living expenses. He may have been unaware of a recent wage settlement on the West Coast which would pay carpenters as much as \$108

Of course Meany was speaking to a carpenter's convention and he may have felt that he had to give them what they wanted to hear. But it is irresponsible for a man who heads the vast labor organization which the irascible old plumber does.

He urged federal subsidy for housing. Which of course means that all taxpayers participate in paying unions high wages. He did not point to increased productivity as the only sound reason for wage boosts.

A responsible attitude such as Mr. Abel's can help lead the country out of inflation and create a new respect for labor and its leaders.

Rewarding A GOP Reject

If members of the Meskill Administration want to run for public office, it is their decision. But the taxpayers of Connecticut should not be forced to pay them for so doing.

Two department heads were forced to resign their posts because they would have been in violation of the federal Hatch Act. The Hatch Act was passed by Congress years ago to insure that those involved in the disbursement of federal funds would not become actively involved in partisan politics, thereby influencing their

Ruben Figueroa resigned as chairman of the Consumer Affairs Department to seek the Republican nomination for Congress in the First District. Edward J. Kozlowski resigned as motor vehicles commissioner to seek the GOP nomination for U.S. senator. Both failed to win the support of the convention delegates.

Figueroa has been appointed deputy commissioner in the Department of Consumer Affairs. Obviously the Meskill Administration wanted to find remainder of the term.

The Kozlowski appointment, however, was handled differently. Kozlowski was reappointed motor vehicles commissioner and Mati Koiva, who had replaced him, returned to his former job as deputy commissioner. As far as Connecticut taxpayers are

concerned, the key issue involves Kozlowski's salary. He was given a raise of \$860 over his previous pay of more than \$30,000 a year. Apparently the Meskill Administration wants to help Kozlowski make up the two months worth of pay that he missed because he had grandiose political ambitions. There appears to be no other justification for giving a man a pay raise when he quit his job to seek political advancement, but then was

rejected by the Republican party. There must be a better way for the Meskill Administration to reward Republican party rejects than to force the taxpayers to pay the bill. - Waterbury Republican

Youth fares, once a real boon to travelers between the ages of 12 and 21, are gone. They disappeared June 1 as the result of a legal challenge which claimed the fares discriminated against the over

The airline industry hated to see them go. Among other things it says traffic across the Atlantic has declined because students who once could make the trip for half price standby or two-thirds price reserved are not now so willing to go.

But there is no move afoot to bring back the fares, for continental U.S. travel anyway. Some carriers have asked that youth fares be restored for transatlantic flights, however, to compete with foreign airlines which are still offering discounts, or to curb the growing practice among students and others of flying to Canada and then departing for Europe. Even with the added trip north of the border Canadian flights across the Atlantic are still cheaper than those originating in the United States for those under 21.

Corp., Contest Award Division, Cincinnati, Ohio. It appears you may be out of luck, along with a lot of other people. According to the Ohio Attorney General's office, the company filed for ankruptcy after being hit by suits from several states as well as actions by the Federal Trade Commission and the U.S. Postal Service. Its bankruptcy petition claims that it owes a lot more han it has -by a margin as high as six to one. Even it there is a settlement, Ohio officials say, the consumer is usually at the bottom of the ist and the least likely to col-

There are two things, however, you or anyone else nvolved with this firm can do to perhaps get some money back, or at least assure your name is on the list of creditors should a setlement come.

The first is to contact your state attorney general's office to determine if your state is one of the several which has filed suit against the firm. If so your name can be added to the list of complai-

Secondly, go to an office supply store, stationary shop or similar outlet and buy a 'proof of claim" form. This form simply lists what you bought, what you spent and other particulars. Send this form to: Court of Bankruptcy 719 U.S. Post Office & Courthouse Building, 5th and Walnut Streets, Cincinnati, Ohio 45202, attention of Ed Schulzinger, receiver in bankruptcy.

Again, neither action will guarantee a refund; but you will have standing should a

Ohio officials say the firm was involved in several operations, including letters to individuals telling them they had won a "free vacation" if they sent in a small sum of money for handling charges. The winner got back a certificate but found out he had to pay his own way to Florida, Nevada or wherever the vacation was.

One sewing machine deal, Ohio officials add, involved notification that you had 'won" \$100 off a \$169 machine - which, it turned out, was only worth \$69 to begin with.





WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Senate passed a bill Tuesday to block a 10 per cent federal excise tax on state lotteries which the Internal Revenue Service said it would levy this

By law, the IRS must impose the tax on wagers made if a state lottery does not mee standards of an exemptio granted by Congress in 1965 to aid New Hampshire, then the only state with a lottery.

The exemption, granted t lotteries where the winners are chosen by a horse race, was narrowly drawn to fit the New Hampshire situation, said Sen. Abraham A. Ribicoff, D-Conn., who introduced the bill to eliminate the tax. 


